~AMON 2 (91)

(Am'non) [Trustworthy, Faithful, Long-Lasting]

- A king of Judah, 661-660 B.C.E, and son of wicked King Manasseh. He began to rule at the age of 22 and followed the idolatrous course of his father's earlier years. The bad conditions described at;
- And I will stretch out my hand against Judah and against all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and I will cut off from this place the remaining one's of the Baal, the name of the foreign-god priests along with the priests. (Zephaniah 1:4)
- She did not listen to a voice. She did not accept discipline. In Yehowah she did not trust. To her God she did not draw near. (Zephaniah 3:2)
- Her princes in the midst of her were roaring lions. Her judges were evening wolves that did not gnaw bones till the morning. (Zephaniah 3:3)
- Her prophets were insolent, were men of treachery. Her priests themselves profaned what was holy, they did violence to the Law. (Zephaniah 3:4)
- Doubtless were developing at this time. After two years on the throne, he was murdered by his own servants. The people of the land 'am ha-'a'rets' put the conspirators to death, placed his son Josiah on the throne, and buried Amon in the garden of Uzza. The genealogy of Jesus includes his name.
- Twenty-two years old was Amon when he began to reign, and for two years he reigned in Jerusalem. And his mother's name was Meshullemeth the daughter of Haruz from Jotbah. (2 Kings 21:19)
- And he continued to do what was bad in Yehowah's eyes, just as Manasseh his father had done. (2 Kings 21:20)
- And he kept walking in all the way that his father had walked, and he continued serving the dungy idols that his father had served and bowing down to them. (2 Kings 21:21)

- Thus he left Yehowah the God of his forefathers, and he did not walk in the way of Yehowah. (2 Kings 21:22)
- Eventually servants of **Amon** conspired against him and put the king to death in his own house. (2 Kings 21:23)
- But the people of the land struck down all the conspirators against King Amon. Then the people of the land made Josiah his son king in place of him. (2 Kings 21:24)
- As for the rest of the affairs of Amon, what he did, are they not written in the book of the affairs of the days of the kings of Judah? (2 Kings 21:25)
- So they buried him in his grave in the garden of Uzza, and Josiah his son began to reign in place of him. (2 Kings 21:26)
- Finally Manasseh lay down with his forefathers, and they buried him at his house, and Amon his son began to reign in place of him. (2 Chronicles 33:20)
- Twenty-two years old was **Amon** when he began to reign, and for two years he reigned in Jerusalem. (2 Chronicles 33:21)
- And he proceeded to do what was bad in Yehowah's eyes, just as Manasseh his father had done, and to all the graven images that Manasseh his father had made Amon sacrificed, and he continued serving them. (2 Chronicles 33:22)
- And he did not humble himself because of Yehowah the same as Manasseh his father humbled himself, for Amon was one that made guiltiness increase. (2 Chronicles 33:23)
- Finally his servants conspired against him and put him to death in his own house. (2 Chronicles 33:24)
- But the people of the land struck down all the conspirators against King Amon, and the people of the land then made Josiah his son king in place of him. (2 Chronicles 33:25)
- Hezekiah became father to Manasseh, Manasseh became father to Amon, Amon became father to Josiah. (Matthew 1:10)
