

~ANDREW (194)

(An'drew) [from a Greek root word meaning man, male person, probably, Manly]

- **A brother of Simon Peter and son of Jonah or John.**
- **Walking alongside the sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter and **Andrew** his brother, letting down a fishing net into the sea, for they were fishers. (**Matthew 4:18**)**
- **In response Jesus said to him; Happy you are, Simon son of Jonah, because flesh and blood did not reveal it to you, but my Father who is in the heavens did. (**Matthew 16:17**)**
- **While **Andrew's** native city was Bethsaida, he and Simon were living together in Capernaum at the time Jesus called them to become fishers of men.**
- **While walking alongside the sea of Galilee he saw Simon and **Andrew** the brother of Simon casting their nets about in the sea, for they were fishers. (**Mark 1:16**)**
- **So Jesus said to them; Come after me, and I shall cause you to become fishers of men. (**Mark 1:17**)**
- **And they went their way into Capernaum. No sooner was it the Sabbath than he entered into the synagogue and began to teach. (**Mark 1:21**)**
- **And immediately they went out of the synagogue and went into the home of Simon and **Andrew** with James and John. (**Mark 1:29**)**
- **Now Philip was from Bethsaida, from the city of **Andrew** and Peter. (**John 1:44**)**
- **Both cities were on the North shore of the Sea of Galilee, where the two brothers engaged in the fishing business in partnership with James and John.**
- **Walking alongside the sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter and **Andrew** his brother, letting down a**

- fishing net into the sea, for they were fishers. (**Matthew 4:18**)
- While walking alongside the sea of Galilee he saw Simon and **Andrew** the brother of Simon casting their nets about in the sea, for they were fishers. (**Mark 1:16**)
 - And likewise both James and John, Zebedee's sons, who were sharers with Simon. But Jesus said to Simon; Stop being afraid. From now on you will be catching men alive. (**Luke 5:10**)
 - **Andrew** was first a disciple of John the Baptizer.
 - Again the next day John was standing with two of his disciples. (**John 1:35**)
 - **Andrew** the brother of Simon Peter was one of the two that heard what John said and followed Jesus. (**John 1:40**)
 - In the fall of **29 C.E.** he was at Bethany on the East side of the Jordan River and heard John the Baptizer introduce Jesus as the Lamb of God.
 - The next day he beheld Jesus coming toward him, and he said, See, the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world! (**John 1:29**)
 - He, along with another disciple, likely John, followed Jesus to his residence and was soon convinced he had found the Messiah. He then found and informed his brother Simon and led him to Jesus.
 - And as he looked at Jesus walking he said; See, the Lamb of God! (**John 1:36**)
 - And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. (**John 1:37**)
 - Then Jesus turned and, getting a view of them following, he said to them; What are you looking for? They said to him; Rabbi, which means, when translated, Teacher, where are you staying? (**John 1:38**)
 - He said to them; Come, and you will see. Accordingly they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day, it was about the tenth hour. (**John 1:39**)

- **Andrew** the brother of Simon Peter was one of the two that heard what John said and followed Jesus. (**John 1:40**)
- First this one found his own brother, Simon, and said to him; We have found the Messiah, which means, when translated, Christ. (**John 1:41**)
- The two brothers returned to their fishing business, but between six months and a year later, after the arrest of John the Baptizer, they, along with James and John, were invited by Jesus to become fishers of men. They immediately abandoned their nets and began accompanying Jesus.
- Walking alongside the sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter and **Andrew** his brother, letting down a fishing net into the sea, for they were fishers. (**Matthew 4:18**)
- And he said to them; Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men. (**Matthew 4:19**)
- At once abandoning the nets, they followed him. (**Matthew 4:20**)
- Now after John was put under arrest Jesus went into Galilee, preaching the Good News of God (**Mark 1:14**)
- While walking alongside the sea of Galilee he saw Simon and **Andrew** the brother of Simon casting their nets about in the sea, for they were fishers. (**Mark 1:16**)
- So Jesus said to them; Come after me, and I shall cause you to become fishers of men. (**Mark 1:17**)
- And at once they abandoned their nets and followed him. (**Mark 1:18**)
- And after going a little farther he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in fact, while they were in their boat mending their nets. (**Mark 1:19**)
- And without delay he called them. In turn they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and went off after him. (**Mark 1:20**)

- In time these four became apostles, and it is notable that **Andrew** is always listed as among the first four in all the apostolic lists.
- The names of the twelve apostles are these, first, Simon, the one called Peter, and **Andrew** his brother, and James the son of Zebedee and John his brother. (**Matthew 10:2**)
- And **Andrew** and Philip and Bartholomew and Matthew and Thomas and James the son of Alphaeus and Thaddaeus and Simon the Cananaean (**Mark 3:18**)
- Simon, whom he also named Peter, and **Andrew** his brother, and James and John, and Philip and Bartholomew. (**Luke 6:14**)
- **Andrew** thereafter receives but brief mention. He and Philip discuss with Jesus the problem of feeding a crowd of about 5,000 men, and **Andrew** offers a suggestion that he himself considers of little practical value about some available food.
- One of his disciples, **Andrew** the brother of Simon Peter, said to him. (**John 6:8**)
- Here is a little boy that has five barley loaves and two small fishes. But what are these among so many? (**John 6:9**)
- At the time of the last Passover festival that they celebrated, Philip comes to **Andrew** for advice about a request of some Greeks to see Jesus, and the two then approach Jesus on the matter.
- Now there were some Greeks among those that came up to worship at the festival. (**John 12:20**)
- These, therefore, approached Philip who was from Bethsaida of Galilee, and they began to request him, saying; Sir, we want to see Jesus. (**John 12:21**)
- Philip came and told **Andrew**. **Andrew** and Philip came and told Jesus. (**John 12:22**)
- He is among the four on the Mount of Olives who ask Jesus for the sign that would mark the conclusion of the existing system of things.
- And as he was sitting on the Mount of Olives with the temple in

view, Peter and James and John and **Andrew** began to ask him privately. (**Mark 13:3**)

- The final mention of **Andrew** by name is shortly after Jesus ascension.
- So, when they had entered, they went up into the upper chamber, where they were staying, Peter as well as John and James and **Andrew**, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the zealous one, and Judas the son of James. (**Acts of Apostles 1:13**)
