~APPEARED (379)

[English, came into view or sight, became visible, emerged, came out, showed, materialized, Opposite of, disappeared]

- During the flood it was in the tenth month that the tops of the mountains first appeared.
- And the waters kept on progressively lessening until the tenth month. In the tenth month, on the first of the month, the tops of the mountains appeared. (Genesis 8:5)
- Yehowah appeared to Abraham promising to give the Promised Land to his seed.
- Yehowah now appeared to Abram and said; To your seed I am going to give this land. After that he built an altar there to Yehowah, who had appeared to him. (Genesis 12:7)
- When Abram was 99 years old Yehowah again appeared to him calling him to a course of faithfulness.
- When Abram got to be ninety-nine years old, then Yehowah appeared to Abram and said to him; I am God Almighty. Walk before me and prove yourself faultless. (Genesis 17:1)
- Yehowah appeared to Abraham among the big trees of Mamre.
- Afterward Yehowah appeared to him among the big trees of Mamre, while he was sitting at the entrance of the tent about the heat of the day. (Genesis 18:1)
- Yehowah told Abraham to not go down into Egypt but to remain in the Promised Land.
- Then Yehowah appeared to him and said; Do not go down to Egypt. Tabernacle in the land that I designate to you. (Genesis 26:2)
- Yehowah God later appeared to Jacob at Bethel.
- After that God said to Jacob; Rise, go up to Bethel and dwell there, and make an altar there to the true God who appeared to

you when you were running away from Esau your brother. (Genesis 35:1)

- God now appeared to Jacob once again during his coming from Paddanaram and blessed him. (Genesis 35:9)
- When Jacob came down into Egypt Joseph appeared to his father Jacob and fell upon his neck in tears.
- Then Joseph had his chariot made ready and went up to meet Israel his father at Goshen. When he appeared to him he at once fell upon his neck and gave way to tears upon his neck again and again. (Genesis 46:29)
- Jacob told Joseph that God himself had appeared to him at Luz.
- And Jacob proceeded to say to Joseph; God Almighty appeared to me at Luz in the land of Canaan that he might bless me. (Genesis 48:3)
- Yehowah angel appeared to Moses in the flame of a fire in the midst of a thornbush.
- Then Yehowah's angel appeared to him in a flame of fire in the midst of a thorn bush. As he kept looking, why, here the thorn bush was burning with the fire and yet the thorn bush was not consumed. (Exodus 3:2)
- Moses was then told to go to the sons of Israel and tell them that the God of their forefathers had appeared to, and spoken to him.
- You go, and you must gather the older men of Israel, and you must say to them, Yehowah the God of your forefathers has appeared to me, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, saying, I will without fail to you and to what is being done to you in Egypt. (Exodus 3:16)
- Signs were then given to Moses to use to convince his people that God had indeed appeared to him.
- In order, that, to quote him, they may believe that Yehowah the God of their forefathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob, has appeared to you. (Exodus 4:5)

- While Aaron was speaking to the people Yehowah's glory appeared in a cloud and all the assembly saw it.
- Then it occurred that as soon as Aaron had spoken to the entire assembly of the sons of Israel, they turned and faced toward the wilderness, and, look! Yehowah's glory appeared in the cloud. (Exodus 16:10)
- After breaking the first two stone tablets, Moses was instructed to cut out two more to replace the one's Moses had destroyed where the words of God had appeared.
- Then Yehowah said to Moses; Carve out for yourself two tablets of stone like the first ones, and I must write upon the tablets the words that appeared on the first tablets, which you shattered. (Exodus 34:1)
- When Moses and Aaron came out of the tent then Yehowah's glory appeared to all the people.
- Finally Moses and Aaron went into the tent of meeting and came out and blessed the people. Then Yehowah's glory appeared to all the people. (Leviticus 9:23)
- A man who thought that he saw evidence of the plague of leprosy had to come and tell the priest as to what has appeared in his house.
- The one to whom the house belongs must then come and tell the priest, saying; Something like a plague has appeared to me in the house. (Leviticus 14:35)
- In the evening what appeared to be fire appeared over the tent of meeting at night.
- Now on the day of setting up the tabernacle the cloud covered the tabernacle of the tent of the Testimony, but in the evening what appeared to be fire continued over the tabernacle until morning. (Numbers 9:15)
- When all the assembly talked of pelting Moses and Aaron with stones then Yehowah's glory appeared over the tent of meeting.
- However, all the assembly talked of pelting them with stones.

And Yehowah's glory appeared on the tent of meeting to all the sons of Israel. (Numbers 14:10)

- Moses counseled Yehowah that if Yehowah destroyed his people then other peoples would tell it out that the God who has appeared to them in the pillar of cloud and fire, could not bring them home safely.
- And they will be bound to tell it to the inhabitants of this land. They have heard that you are Yehowah in among this people, who has appeared face to face. You are Yehowah, and your cloud is standing over them, and you are going before them in the pillar of cloud by day and in the pillar of fire by night. (Numbers 14:14)
- When Korah assembled all the people together at the tent of meeting to resist Moses and Aaron then Yehowah's glory appeared to all the assembly.
- When Korah got all the assembly together against them at the entrance of the tent of meeting, then Yehowah's glory appeared to all the assembly. (Numbers 16:19)
- Moses, after cutting out the second set of tablets brought them up into the mountain and Yehowah again wrote his Laws upon them after which he was instructed to place them into the Ark of the Covenant.
- And I shall write upon the tablets the words that appeared on the first tablets, which you shattered, and you must place them in the ark. (Deuteronomy 10:2)
- Yehowah appeared over the tent of meeting in a pillar of cloud which stood at the entrance of the tent.
- Then Yehowah appeared at the tent in the pillar of cloud, and the pillar of cloud began to stand by the entrance of the tent.

 (Deuteronomy 31:15)
- Yehowah angel appeared to Gideon telling him that Yehowah was with him in what he was doing.
- Then Yehowah's angel appeared to him and said to him, Yehowah is with you, you valiant, mighty one. (Judges 6:12)

- Yehowah's angel appeared to Manoah acknowledging her barrenness and telling her of the coming birth of her son.
- In time Yehowah's angel appeared to the woman and said to her; Look, now, you are barren and have borne no child. And you will certainly become pregnant and give birth to a son. (Judges 13:3)
- Manoah ran and told her husband about the man who had appeared to her.
- Immediately the woman hurried and ran and told her husband and said to him; Look! The man that came the other day to me has appeared to me. (Judges 13:10)
- David's action of taking Bathsheba as a wife appeared bad before Yehowah and so their firstborn son died at Yehowah's hand.
- When the mourning period was past, David immediately sent and took her home to his house, and she came to be his wife. In time she bore to him a son, but the thing that David had done appeared bad in the eyes of Yehowah. (2 Samuel 11:27)
- Yehowah appeared to Solomon in a dream by night and told him to ask for whatever he wanted.
- In Gibeon Yehowah appeared to Solomon in a dream by night, and God proceeded to say; Request what I should give you. (1 Kings 3:5)
- Then also a second time Yehowah appeared to Solomon in a dream.
- Then Yehowah appeared to Solomon the second time, the same as he had appeared to him in Gibeon. (1 Kings 9:2)
- Josiah cleared out all of the detestable idols that had appeared in the land of Judah and in Jerusalem so as to carry out the word of Yehowah found in his book of the Law that Moses wrote down.
- And also the spirit mediums and the professional foretellers of events and the teraphim and the dungy idols and all the disgusting things that had appeared in the land of Judah and in Jerusalem Josiah cleared out, in order, that he might actually carry out the words of the Law that were written in the book that

Hilkiah the priest had found at the house of Yehowah. (2 Kings 23:24)

- During the night Yehowah appeared to Solomon and asked him,
 What shall I give you?
- During that night God appeared to Solomon and then said to him;
 Ask! What shall I give you? (2 Chronicles 1:7)
- Finally Solomon started to build the house of Yehowah in Jerusalem on Mount Moriah, where Yehowah had appeared to David his father, in the place that David had prepared on the threshing floor of Ornan the Jebusite. (2 Chronicles 3:1)
- Yehowah now appeared to Solomon during the night and said to him; I have heard your prayer, and I have chosen this place for myself as a house of sacrifice. (2 Chronicles 7:12)
- The green grass has departed, and the new grass has appeared, and the vegetation of the mountains has been gathered. (Proverbs 27:25)
- Blossoms themselves have appeared in the land, the very time of vine trimming has arrived, and the voice of the turtledove itself has been heard in our land. (Song of Solomon 2:12)
- From far away Yehowah himself appeared to me, saying; And with a love to time indefinite I have loved you. That is why I have drawn you with loving-kindness. (Jeremiah 31:3)
- And at the end of ten days their countenances appeared better and fatter in flesh than all the children who were eating the delicacies of the king. (Daniel 1:15)
- In the third year of the kingship of Belshazzar the king, there was a vision that appeared to me, even me, Daniel, after the one appearing to me at the start. (Daniel 8:1)
- But after he had thought these things over, look! Yehowah's angel appeared to him in a dream, saying; Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife home, for that which has been begotten in her is by Holy Spirit. (Matthew 1:20)
- After they had withdrawn, look! Yehowah's angel appeared in a

dream to Joseph, saying; Get up, take the young child and its mother and flee into Egypt, and stay there until I give you word, for Herod is about to search for the young child to destroy it. (Matthew 2:13)

- When Herod had deceased, look! Yehowah's angel appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt (Matthew 2:19)
- When the blade sprouted and produced fruit, then the weeds appeared also. (Matthew 13:26)
- And, look! There appeared to them Moses and Elijah, conversing with him. (Matthew 17:3)
- Also, Elijah with Moses appeared to them, and they were conversing with Jesus. (Mark 9:4)
- But all the things that had been commanded they related briefly to those around Peter. Further, after these things, Jesus himself sent out through them from the east to the west the holy and incorruptible proclamation of everlasting salvation. (Mark 16:9)
- Moreover, after these things he appeared in another form to two of them walking along, as they were going into the country.
 (Mark 16:12)
- But later he appeared to the eleven themselves as they were reclining at the table, and he reproached their lack of faith and hardheartedness, because they did not believe those who had beheld him now raised up from the dead. (Mark 16:14)
- To him Yehowah's angel appeared, standing at the right side of the incense altar. (Luke 1:11)
- But by others that Elijah had appeared, but by still others that a certain one of the ancient prophets had risen. (Luke 9:8)
- These appeared with glory and began talking about his departure that he was destined to fulfill at Jerusalem. (Luke 9:31)
- Then an angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. (Luke 22:43)
- However, these sayings appeared as nonsense to them and they

would not believe the women. (Luke 24:11)

- Saying; For a fact the Lord was raised up and he appeared to Simon! (Luke 24:34)
- This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after his being raised up from the dead. (John 21:14)
- He said; Men, brothers and fathers, hear. The God of glory appeared to our forefather Abraham while he was in Mesopotamia, before he took up residence in Haran. (Acts of Apostles 7:2)
- And the next day he appeared to them as they were fighting, and he tried to bring them together again in peace, saying; Men, you are brothers. Why do you treat each other unjustly? (Acts of Apostles 7:26)
- And when forty years were fulfilled, there appeared to him in the wilderness of Mount Sinai an angel in the fiery flame of a thornbush. (Acts of Apostles 7:30)
- This Moses, whom they disowned, saying; Who appointed you ruler and judge? This man God sent off as both ruler and deliverer by the hand of the angel that appeared to him in the thornbush. (Acts of Apostles 7:35)
- So Ananias went off and entered into the house, and he laid his hands upon him and said; Saul, brother, the Lord, the Jesus that appeared to you on the road over which you were coming, has sent me forth, in order, that you may recover sight and be filled with Holy Spirit. (Acts of Apostles 9:17)
- And during the night a vision appeared to Paul. A certain
 Macedonian man was standing and entreating him and saying;
 Step over into Macedonia and help us. (Acts of Apostles 16:9)
- When, now, neither sun nor stars appeared for many days, and no little tempest was lying upon us, all hope of our being saved finally began to be cut off. (Acts of Apostles 27:20)
- And that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. (1 Corinthians 15:5)

- After that he appeared to upward of five hundred brothers at one time, the most of whom remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep in death. (1 Corinthians 15:6)
- After that he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. (1 Corinthians 15:7)
- But last of all he appeared also to me as if to one born prematurely. (1 Corinthians 15:8)
- Indeed, the sacred secret of this godly devotion is admittedly great. He was made manifest in flesh, was declared righteous in spirit, appeared to angels, was preached about among nations, was believed upon in the world, was received up in glory. (1 Timothy 3:16)
