

~APPEAR (259)

[English, come into view or sight, become visible, emerge, come out, show, materialize, Opposite of, **disappear**]

- In the third creative day the dry land **appeared**.
- And God went on to say; Let the waters under the heavens be brought together into one place and let the dry land **appear**. And it came to be so. (**Genesis 1:9**)
- After the flood was the first occurrence of a rainbow **appearing** within the cloud.
- And it shall occur that when I bring a cloud over the earth, then the rainbow will certainly **appear** in the cloud. (**Genesis 9:14**)
- Yehowah **appeared** to Isaac with a divine promise to multiply his seed.
- And Yehowah proceeded to **appear** to him during that night and to say; I am the God of Abraham your father. Do not be afraid, because I am with you, and I will bless you and multiply your seed on account of Abraham my servant. (**Genesis 26:24**)
- Moses was fearful that his Israelite brothers would not believe that Yehowah had **appeared** to him.
- However, Moses in answering said; But suppose they do not believe me and do not listen to my voice, because they are going to say; Yehowah did not **appear** to you. (**Exodus 4:1**)
- Yehowah told Moses that in the past he had **appeared** to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.
- And I used to **appear** to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob as God Almighty, but as respects my name Yehowah I did not make myself known to them. (**Exodus 6:3**)
- At the three yearly festivals to Yehowah Israelites were to **appear** before Yehowah with gifts.

- You will keep the festival of unfermented cakes. You will eat unfermented cakes seven days, just as I have commanded you, at the appointed time in the month of Abib, because in it you came out of Egypt. And they must not **appear** before me empty-handed. (**Exodus 23:15**)
- On three occasions in the year every male of yours will **appear** before the face of the true Lord, Yehowah. (**Exodus 23:17**)
- And the firstling of an ass you are to redeem with a sheep. But if you will not redeem it, then you must break its neck. Every firstborn of your sons you are to redeem. And they must not **appear** before me empty-handed. (**Exodus 34:20**)
- Three times in the year every male of yours is to **appear** before the true Lord, Yehowah, the God of Israel. (**Exodus 34:23**)
- Moses instructed Aaron to take certain offerings because today Yehowah will **appear** before you.
- And a bull and a ram for communion sacrifices to sacrifice them before Yehowah, and a grain offering moistened with oil, because today is when Yehowah will certainly **appear** to you. (**Leviticus 9:4**)
- And Moses went on to say; This is the thing that Yehowah has commanded you should do, that the glory of Yehowah may **appear** to you. (**Leviticus 9:6**)
- If a scab should **reappear** after his **appearing** before the priest then he also must **reappear** before the priest for inspection,
- But if the scab has unquestionably spread in the skin after his **appearing** before the priest for the establishment of his purification, he must then **appear** the second time before the priest. (**Leviticus 13:7**)
- Yehowah's presence was to **appear** to Moses and Aaron above the cover of the ark in a light known as the Shekinah light.
- And Yehowah proceeded to say to Moses; Speak to Aaron your brother, that he should not at all times come into the holy place inside the curtain, in front of the cover which is upon the Ark, that he may not die, because in a cloud I shall **appear** over the

cover. (**Leviticus 16:2**)

- **Yehowah came to back up Moses and Aaron by **appearing** over the tent of meeting when they rebelled against his servants**
- **And it came about that when the assembly had congregated themselves together against Moses and Aaron, they then turned toward the tent of meeting, and, look! The cloud covered it, and Yehowah's glory began to **appear**. (**Numbers 16:42**)**
- **Then Moses and Aaron came from before the congregation to the entrance of the tent of meeting and fell upon their faces, and Yehowah's glory began to **appear** to them. (**Numbers 20:6**)**
- **All Israelites were commanded to **appear** before Yehowah three times in a year at the yearly festivals.**
- **Three times in the year every male of yours should **appear** before Yehowah your God in the place that he will choose, in the festival of the unfermented cakes and in the festival of weeks and in the festival of booths, and none should appear before Yehowah empty-handed. (**Deuteronomy 16:16**)**
- **Hannah brought the young child Hannah to **appear** before Yehowah by bringing him to the temple to serve there.**
- **As for Hannah, she did not go up, for she had said to her husband; As soon as the boy is weaned, I must bring him, and he must **appear** before Yehowah and dwell there to time indefinite. (**1 Samuel 1:22**)**
- **Yehowah revealed himself to Samuel by **appearing** to him in Shiloh.**
- **And Yehowah proceeded to **appear** again in Shiloh, because Yehowah revealed himself to Samuel in Shiloh by the word of Yehowah. (**1 Samuel 3:21**)**
- **David counseled Joab not to let his counsel **appear** bad to him thus encouraging him.**
- **At that David said to the messenger; This is what you will say to Joab; Do not let this matter **appear** bad in your eyes, for the sword eats up one as well as another. Intensify your battle**

- against the city and throw it down. And encourage him. (**2 Samuel 11:25**)
- As Jonathan and Ahimaaz were standing at En-rogel, a maidservant went off and told them. So they themselves went off, as they had to tell King David, for they were not able to **appear** entering the city. (**2 Samuel 17:17**)
 - Yehowah's Messiah prophetically states that he thirsts for God, which thirst can only be filled at his **appearing** before his glory.
 - My soul indeed thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and **appear** before God? (**Psalms 42:2**)
 - The Psalmist requests that faithful one's will be appreciative of Yehowah's many works, that they may **appear** to your servants
 - May your activity **appear** to your own servants and your splendor upon their sons. (**Psalms 90:16**)
 - Yehowah promises to **appear** in Zion and to build her up.
 - For Yehowah will certainly build up Zion, he must **appear** in his glory. (**Psalms 102:16**)
 - Yehowah promises to **appear** to faithful one's who have been excluded and hated by their brothers who say they want to glorify Yehowah, but do not.
 - Hear the word of Yehowah, you men who are trembling at his word; Your brothers that are hating you, that are excluding you by reason of my name, said; May Yehowah be glorified! He must also **appear** with rejoicing on your part, and they are the ones that will be put to shame. (**Isaiah 66:5**)
 - Yehowah said to Judah that her sister Samaria had not sinned as badly as she so that she made her sister **appear** righteous comparatively.
 - And as for Samaria, she has not sinned even up to half of your sins, but you kept making your detestable things abound more than they did, so that you made your sisters **appear** righteous because of all your detestable things that you carried on. (**Ezekiel 16:51**)

- You also, bear your humiliation when you must argue in favor of your sisters. Because of your sins in which you acted more detestably than they did, they are more righteous than you. And you also, be ashamed and bear your humiliation in that you make your sisters **appear** righteous. (**Ezekiel 16:52**)
- Daniel told the king's servant to test them out after eating vegetables and simple foods and see if they **appear** better than those eating the king's delicacies.
- And let our countenances and the countenance of the children who are eating the delicacies of the king **appear** before you, and according to what you see do with your servants. (**Daniel 1:13**)
- Fasting is between a man and God, but some tried to **appear** righteous to other men by disfiguring their faces during fasting. Many other things also the Jews did just for **appearances**.
- When you are fasting, stop becoming sad-faced like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that they may **appear** to men to be fasting. Truly I say to you, They are having their reward in full. (**Matthew 6:16**)
- That you may **appear** to be fasting, not to men, but to your Father who is in secrecy, then your Father who is looking on in secrecy will repay you. (**Matthew 6:18**)
- Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! Because you resemble whitewashed graves, which outwardly indeed **appear** beautiful but inside are full of dead men's bones and of every sort of uncleanness. (**Matthew 23:27**)
- In that way you also, outwardly indeed, **appear** righteous to men, but inside you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness. (**Matthew 23:28**)
- The sign of the Son of Man will **appear** in heaven.
- And then the sign of the Son of man will **appear** in heaven, and then all the tribes of the earth will beat themselves in lamentation, and they will see the Son of man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. (**Matthew 24:30**)

- Jesus was not fooled as to who ruled the world for he said that the rulers **appear** to rule the nations.
- But Jesus, after calling them to him, said to them; You know that those who **appear** to be ruling the nations lord it over them and their great one's wield authority over them. (**Mark 10:42**)
- Paul did not offer counsel so as to **appear** better than his brothers but would rather **appear** disapproved and have them be obedient to God.
- Now we pray to God that you may do nothing wrong, not that we ourselves may **appear** approved, but that you may be doing what is fine, though we ourselves may **appear** disapproved. (**2 Corinthians 13:7**)
- Christ after his resurrection **appeared** before the throne of God in our behalf.
- For Christ entered, not into a holy place made with hands, which is a copy of the reality, but into heaven itself, now to **appear** before the person of God for us. (**Hebrews 9:24**)
- Paul showed that the material expressions of true worship like the tent of meeting and utensils have come to be out of things that do not **appear**.
- By faith we perceive that the systems of things were put in order by God's word, so that what is beheld has come to be out of things that do not **appear**. (**Hebrews 11:3**)
