~APPLY (92)

[English, be relevant, relate, be appropriate, be valid, pertain, affect, concern]

- Moses instructed Israel to apply his words to their lives.
- And you must apply these words of mine to your heart and your soul and bind them as a sign upon your hand, and they must serve as a frontlet band between your eyes. (Deuteronomy 11:18)
- He went on to say to them; Apply your hearts to all the words that I am speaking in warning to you today, that you may command your sons to take care to do all the words of this law. (Deuteronomy 32:46)
- The wife of Jeroboam came to apply to Ahijah for assistance.
- And Yehowah himself had said to Ahijah; Here is the wife of Jeroboam coming to apply for a word from you regarding her son, for he is sick. This way and that is how you should speak to her. And it will occur that as soon as she arrives, she will be making herself unrecognizable. (1 Kings 14:5)
- Job showed that he would apply to Yehowah and submit his cause to him, likely through prayer.
- However, I myself would apply to God, and to God I would submit my cause. (Job 5:8)
- Job felt that like something glued to him he could not get rid of his error.
- Sealed up in a bag is my revolt, and you apply glue over my error.
 (Job 14:17)
- The congregator counsels us to apply our hearts to knowledge.
- Incline your ear and hear the words of the wise ones, that you may apply your very heart to my knowledge. (Proverbs 22:17)

- Isaiah shows that it is wrong for living persons to apply to spirit mediums about the dead.
- And in case they should say to you people; Apply to the spiritistic mediums or to those having a spirit of prediction who are chirping and making utterances in low tones, is it not to its God that any people should apply? Should there be application to dead persons in behalf of living persons? (Isaiah 8:19)
- Yehowah challenges other gods to tell us the future if they can so that we may apply ourselves to their counsel. None ever have done so.
- Produce and tell to us the things that are going to happen. The first things, what they were, do tell, that we may apply our heart and know the future of them. Or cause us to hear even the things that are coming. (Isaiah 41:22)
- At seeing the interpretation of the dream Daniel told Belteshazzar, may the dream apply to those hating you.
- At that time Daniel himself, whose name is Belteshazzar, was astonished for a moment, and his very thoughts began to frighten him. The king was answering and saying; O Belteshazzar, do not let the dream and the interpretation themselves frighten you. Belteshazzar was answering and saying; O my lord, may the dream apply to those hating you, and its interpretation to your adversaries. (Daniel 4:19)
- Jesus told his hometown people that they would say apply this saying to him, physician heal thy self.
- At this he said to them; No doubt you will apply this illustration to me, Physician, cure yourself, the things we heard as having happened in Capernaum do also here in your home territory. (Luke 4:23)
- Paul showed that his counsel that he was a steward of God applied to himself and Apollos
- Now, brothers, these things I have transferred so as to apply to myself and Apollos for your good, that in our case you may learn the rule. Do not go beyond the things that are written, in order, that you may not be puffed up individually in favor of the one against the other. (1 Corinthians 4:6)
