## ~APPOINT (236)

[English, employ, sign up, hire, assign, take on, select, choose, Opposite of, dismiss]

- Joseph counseled Pharaoh to appoint overseers over the land to gather up and preserve the excess foodstuffs of the seven good years.
- Let Pharaoh act and appoint overseers over the land, and he must take up one fifth of the land of Egypt during the seven years of plenty. (Genesis 41:34)
- God appointed Joseph a father to Pharaoh for it was Joseph's God given wisdom that fathered the nation of Egypt through a great famine.
- So now it was not you who sent me here, but it was the true God, that he might appoint me a father to Pharaoh and a lord for all his house and as one dominating over all the land of Egypt. (Genesis 45:8)
- Pharaoh later appointed Joseph father and brothers as cattle chiefs over his flocks.
- The land of Egypt is at your disposal. Have your father and your brothers dwell in the very best of the land. Let them dwell in the land of Goshen, and if you know that there are among them courageous men, you must appoint them cattle chiefs over what is mine. (Genesis 47:6)
- The Levites were appointed over the tabernacle and all its furnishings.
- And you yourself appoint the Levites over the tabernacle of the Testimony and over all its utensils and over everything that belongs to it. They themselves will carry the tabernacle and all its utensils, and they themselves will minister at it, and around the tabernacle they are to camp. (Numbers 1:50)
- Moses was told by God to appoint Aaron and his sons to the priesthood.

- And you should appoint Aaron and his sons, and they must take care of their priesthood, and any stranger coming near should be put to death. (Numbers 3:10)
- When the spies returned from spying out Canaan the people wanted to appoint another leader than Moses and Aaron and go back to Egypt.
- They even went to saying to one another; Let us appoint a head, and let us return to Egypt! (Numbers 14:4)
- Moses asked Yehowah to appoint his successor and Joshua the son of Nun was chosen.
- Let Yehowah the God of the spirits of all sorts of flesh appoint over the assembly a man (Numbers 27:16)
- Officers and Chiefs were appointed over the army to manage it.
- And it must occur that when the officers have finished speaking to the people, they must also appoint chiefs of the armies at the head of the people. (Deuteronomy 20:9)
- Eli blessed Elkanah and asked Yehowah to appoint for her another son to replace Samuel whom she gave to Yehowah's service at the temple.
- And Eli blessed Elkanah and his wife and said; May Yehowah appoint to you an offspring from this wife in place of the thing lent, that was lent to Yehowah. And they went to their place. (1 Samuel 2:20)
- Samuel was asked to appoint a king over Israel because his own sons did not walk in his way. Then he was told to warn them about the responsibility they would share to support the king.
- And said to him; Look! You yourself have grown old, but your own sons have not walked in your ways. Now do appoint for us a king to judge us like all the nations. (1 Samuel 8:5)
- And to appoint for himself chiefs over thousands and chiefs over fifties, and some to do his plowing and to reap his harvest and to make his war instruments and his chariot instruments. (1 Samuel 8:12)

- Saul maddened about the covenant David and Jonathan concluded together begged his men to be loyal to his kingship, offering them vineyards and appointments to being chiefs in his army.
- Then Saul said to his servants stationed about him: Listen, please, you Benjaminites. Will the son of Jesse also give to all of you fields and vineyards? Will he appoint all of you chiefs of thousands and chiefs of hundreds? (1 Samuel 22:7)
- Achish appointed David a guardian of his head always, because he trusted David.
- At that David said to Achish; That is why you yourself know what your servant is to do. Accordingly Achish said to David; That is why guardian of my head I shall appoint you always. (1 Samuel 28:2)
- Yehowah promised to appoint a place for Israel and plant them there undisturbed.
- And I shall certainly appoint a place for my people Israel and plant them, and they will indeed reside where they are, and no more will they be disturbed, and the sons of unrighteousness will not afflict them again as they did at the first. (2 Samuel 7:10)

- In place of your forefathers there will come to be your sons, whom you will appoint as princes in all the earth. (Psalms 45:16)
- Disloyal Judas is here referred to. Satan entered into him and he betrayed the Son of Man.
- Appoint over him someone wicked, and may a resister himself keep standing at his right hand. (Psalms 109:6)
