~AR (84) [probably, City]

- A city of Moab, possibly its capital. It was on the South side of the Arnon Valley, but its precise location is uncertain.
- And the mouth of the torrent valleys, which has bent itself toward the seat of Ar and has leaned against the border of Moab. (Numbers 21:15)
- At times Ar is used as synonymous with Moab.
- You are passing today by the territory of Moab, that is, Ar. (Deuteronomy 2:18)
- Yehowah then said to me; Do not molest Moab or engage in war with them, because I shall not give you any of his land as a holding, for to the sons of Lot I have given Ar as a holding.

 (Deuteronomy 2:9)
- Just the same as the sons of Esau dwelling in Seir and the Moabites dwelling in Ar did to me, until I shall pass over the Jordan into the land that Yehowah our God is giving to us. (Deuteronomy 2:29)
- At one time the limits of Moab extended North of the Arnon, but this region was taken from them by King Sihon of the Amorites.
- For Heshbon was the city of Sihon. He was the king of the Amorites, and it was he who fought with the king of Moab formerly and went taking all his land out of his hand as far as the Arnon. (Numbers 21:26)
- That is why the sayers of mock verses would say; Come to Heshbon. Let the city of Sihon be built and be proved firmly set up. (Numbers 21:27)
- For a fire has come out of Heshbon, a flame from the town of Sihon. It has consumed Ar of Moab, the owners of the high places of the Arnon. (Numbers 21:28)

- The Israelites did not attack Moab, since Yehowah had forbidden them to do so, having given the territory of Moab, that is, Ar, to the sons of Lot as a holding.
- Yehowah then said to me; Do not molest Moab or engage in war with them, because I shall not give you any of his land as a holding, for to the sons of Lot I have given Ar as a holding.

 (Deuteronomy 2:9)
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- In his pronouncement of desolations against Moab, Isaiah foretold that Ar would be silenced along with the other principal cities of Moab.
- The pronouncement against Moab! Because in the night it has been despoiled, Ar of Moab itself has been silenced. Because in the night it has been despoiled, Kir of Moab itself has been silenced. (Isaiah 15:1)
- Since the name Ar probably means City, some suggest that the city of Moab, Hebrew, 'ir Moh- 'av' mentioned at;
- When Balak got to hear that Balaam had come, he at once went out to meet him at the city of Moab, which is on the bank of the Arnon, which is on the extremity of the territory. (Numbers 22:36)
- And also the city of Aroer. Both refer to Ar.
- From Aroer, which is by the bank of the torrent valley of Arnon, and the city that is in the torrent valley, as far as Gilead, there proved to be no town that was too high up for us. Yehowah our God abandoned them all to us. (Deuteronomy 2:36)
