- A name popularly used today for several unrelated poisonous snakes. Greek, a-spis'.
- The word asps appears once in the Holy Bible, at;
- Their throat is an opened grave, they have used deceit with their tongues. Poison of asps is behind their lips. (Romans 3:13)
- Where the apostle Paul, speaking of sinners, says; Poison of asps is behind their lips. Here the apostle is quoting from;
- They have sharpened their tongue like that of a serpent, the venom of the horned viper is under their lips. (Psalms 140:3)
- The venom of the horned viper is under their lips. Therefore, the asps referred to at;
- Their throat is an opened grave, they have used deceit with their tongues. Poison of asps is behind their lips. (Romans 3:13)
- Must be horned vipers.
