~ASYNCRITUS (16) (A-syn'cri-tus) [Without Compare]

- A Christian in Rome to whom the apostle Paul sent a greeting in his inspired letter to the Romans written from Corinth about 56 C.E.
- Greet Asyncritus, Phlegon, Hermes, Patrobas, Hermas, and the brothers with them. (Romans 16:14)
- Further information on Asyncritus is not provided in the Scriptures, however, archaeological evidence in inscriptions and papyri indicates that the name Asyncritus was used to some extent at that time.
