

~AZMAVETH 5 (29)

(Az'ma-veth) [Death Is Strong]

- A town situated within the territory of Benjamin, also called **Beth-azmaveth**. Exiles from there were among those returning after the exile.
- And these were the sons of the jurisdictional district that went up out of the captivity of the exiled people whom Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon had taken into exile at Babylon and who later returned to Jerusalem and Judah, each one to his own city. (**Ezra 2:1**)
- The sons of **Azmaveth**, forty-two. (**Ezra 2:24**)
- The men of **Beth-azmaveth**, forty-two. (**Nehemiah 7:28**)
- At the inauguration of the wall of restored Jerusalem, the town provided some of the singers for the occasion.
- And from Beth-gilgal and from the fields of Geba and **Azmaveth**, for there were settlements that the singers had built for themselves all around Jerusalem. (**Nehemiah 12:29**)
- It is identified with modern Hizmeh or Hizma, about 8 kilometers (5 miles) North-Northeast of Jerusalem, between Geba and Anathoth.
