

~BAALATH-BEER (31)

(Ba'al-ath-be'er) [Mistress of the Well]

- An enclave city of Simeon within the territorial limits of Judah.
- Then the second lot came out for Simeon, for the tribe of the sons of Simeon by their families. And their inheritance came to be in the midst of the inheritance of the sons of Judah. (Joshua 19:1)
- And all the settlements that were all around these cities as far as Baalath-beer, Ramah of the south. This was the inheritance of the tribe of the sons of Simeon by their families. (Joshua 19:8)
- Also called Ramah of the south, or Negeb, it is evidently referred to simply as Baal at;
- And all their settlements that were all around these cities were as far as Baal. These were their dwelling places and their genealogical enrollments for them. (1 Chronicles 4:33)
- And may be the same as the Ramoth of the south at;
- To those who were in Bethel, and to those in Ramoth of the south, and to those in Jattir. (1 Samuel 30:27)
- The references to it would place it South of Beer-sheba, well into the Negeb
