[English, poorly, deficiently, faultily, defectively, imperfectly, shoddily, roughly, inadequately]

- Lot pleaded with the men of Sodom not to act **badly**.
- Then he said; Please, my brothers, do not act **badly**. (**Genesis 19:7**)
- The Egyptians acted **badly** against it enslaving them.
- And the Egyptians went treating us **badly** and afflicting us and putting hard slavery upon us. (**Deuteronomy 26:6**)
- Israel was defeated by the Philistines when the battle went **badly** for them.

- It went **badly** with Moses because the sons of Israel quarreled with him there.
- Further, they caused provocation at the waters of Meribah, so that it went **badly** with Moses by reason of them. (**Psalms 106:32**)
- One going surety for a stranger will fare **badly**.
- One will positively fare **badly** because he has gone surety for a stranger, but the one hating handshaking is keeping carefree. (**Proverbs 11:15**)
- One having dealings with the stupid one's will also fare **badly**.
- He that is walking with wise persons will become wise, but he that is having dealings with the stupid one's will fare **badly**.. (**Proverbs 13:20**)
- Yehowah promised to collect together the people whom he had previously exiled or treated **badly**.
- In that day, is the utterance of Yehowah, I will gather her that was limping, and her that was dispersed I will collect together, even her whom I have treated **badly**. (**Micah 4:6**)
