## ~BEER-LAHAI-ROI (76)

(Be'er-la'hai-roi) [Well of the Living One Who Sees Me]

- Hagar, Sarai's Egyptian maidservant, when fleeing from her mistress wrath followed the way to Shur, leading through the Negeb down to Egypt. Reaching a certain fountain Hebrew, 'a'yin, however, she was reassured by an angel, instructed to return to her mistress, and told of the birth and future of Ishmael, whose name means God Hears, Listens. Therefore, the well there was called Beer-lahai-roi, Hagar saying of Yehowah; You are a God of sight.
- Later Yehowah's angel found her at a fountain of waters in the wilderness, at the fountain on the way to Shur. (Genesis 16:7)
- And he began to say; Hagar, maidservant of Sarai, just where have you come from and where are you going? To this she said, Why, from Sarai my mistress I am running away. (Genesis 16:8)
- And Yehowah's angel went on to say to her: Return to your mistress and humble yourself under her hand. (Genesis 16:9)
- Then Yehowah's angel said to her; I shall greatly multiply your seed, so that it will not be numbered for multitude. (Genesis 16:10)
- Further Yehowah's angel added to her; Here you are pregnant, and you shall give birth to a son and must call his name Ishmael. For Yehowah has heard your affliction. (Genesis 16:11)
- As for him, he will become a zebra of a man. His hand will be against everyone, and the hand of everyone will be against him, and before the face of all his brothers he will tabernacle. (Genesis 16:12)
- Then she began to call the name of Yehowah, who was speaking to her; You are a God of sight, for she said; Have I here actually looked upon him who sees me? (Genesis 16:13)
- That is why the well was called **Beerlahairoi**. Here it is between Kadesh and Bered. (**Genesis 16:14**)

- Later, Isaac was coming from the way that goes to Beer-lahai-roi in the Negeb when he caught sight of the camel caravan bringing his future bride, Rebekah.
- Now Isaac had come from the way that goes to Beerlahairoi, for he was dwelling in the land of the Negeb. (Genesis 24:62)
- And Isaac was out walking in order to meditate in the field at about the falling of evening. When he raised his eyes and looked, why, there camels were coming! (Genesis 24:63)
- Following Abraham's death, Isaac resided close by Beer-lahai-roi.
- And it developed that after Abraham's death God continued to bless Isaac his son, and Isaac was dwelling close by Beerlahairoi. (Genesis 25:11)
- Beer-lahai-roi is stated to have been between Kadesh and Bered.
- That is why the well was called **Beerlahairoi**. Here it is between Kadesh and Bered. (**Genesis 16:14**)
- A Bedouin tradition places it at `Ain Muweilih, about 19 kilometers (12 miles) Northwest of `Ain Qedeis, the probable site of Kadesh-barnea. But the absence of any clear identification of Bered leaves the identification uncertain.
