~BEEROTH BENE-JAAKAN (26) (Be-er'oth Ben'e-ja'a-kan) [Wells of the Sons of Jaakan]

- A place at which the Israelites camped perhaps more than once during their wanderings in the wilderness, the last time being shortly before Aaron's death on Mount Hor.
- And the sons of Israel pulled away from Beeroth Bene-jaakan for Moserah. There Aaron died, and he got to be buried there, and Eleazar his son began to act as priest instead of him. (Deuteronomy 10:6)
- It is tentatively identified with el-Birein, about 62 kilometers (38 miles) Southwest of Beer-sheba and near modern `Ezuz. There are wells here, and the probable location of Kadesh-barnea is but a few miles south. Nelson Glueck comments; There is a strikingly large number of antiquity sites in this district. [Rivers in the Desert, 1960, p. 97]. Beeroth Bene-jaakan is evidently referred to as simply Bene-jaakan at;
- Then they pulled away from Moseroth and went camping in Bene-jaakan. (Numbers 33:31)
