- A beverage rather low in alcohol content, brewed by slow fermentation from wheat or other grain. The Hebrew word so've', rendered wheat beer, may also be translated liquor.
- Your silver itself has become scummy dross. Your wheat beer is diluted with water. (Isaiah 1:22) Footnote
- Their wheat beer being gone, they have positively treated woman as a harlot. Her shielders have positively loved dishonor. (Hosea 4:18) Footnote
- Although they are being interwoven even as thorns and they are drunken as with their wheat beer, they will certainly be devoured like stubble fully dry. (Nahum 1:10) Footnote
- Cuneiform tablets reveal that the art of brewing beer from grain was practiced in ancient Mesopotamia as early as the Third Millennium B.C.E. When Abraham first arrived in Egypt he probably found that beer was already a common drink there.
- At a later date, it is said; Ramses III prized beer so highly that he offered up some 114,000 Liters (30,000 gallons) a year to his gods. Many Philistine beer mugs with their strainer spouts have been found. Those various nations, it seems, had a great variety of beers to suit every taste sweet beer, dark beer, perfumed beer, sparkling beer, spiced beer served either hot or cold, watered down or thick and syrupy.
