~BELEVING (132)

[English, considering, thinking, deeming, supposing, judging, accepting as true, trusting, Opposite of, doubting]

- In the early Christian congregation those believing could then expel demons and speak with tongues.
- Furthermore, these signs will accompany those believing; By the use of my name they will expel demons, they will speak with tongues. (Mark 16:17)
- Jesus disciples out of sheer joy were not believing that it was him.
- But while they were still not believing for sheer joy and were wondering, he said to them; Do you have something there to eat? (Luke 24:41)
- Everyone believing in Jesus Christ may have everlasting life.
- That everyone believing in him may have everlasting life. (John 3:15)
- Jesus knew that there were some of his followers that were not believing in him, and one who would betray him.
- But there are some of you that do not believe. For from the beginning Jesus knew who were the one's not believing and who was the one that would betray him. (John 6:64)
- Jesus appeared to Thomas especially so that he would stop being unbelieving and become believing by actually seeing his wounds in his body.
- Next he said to Thomas; Put your finger here, and see my hands, and take your hand and stick it into my side, and stop being unbelieving but become believing. (John 20:27)
- John wrote his Gospel account, so that many would believe and get everlasting life.
- But these have been written down that you may believe that

Jesus is the Christ the Son of God, and that, because of believing, you may have life by means of his name. (John 20:31)

- was the son of a believing Christian Jewish woman, but of a Greek father.
- So he arrived at Derbe and also at Lystra. And, look! A certain disciple was there by the name of Timothy, the son of a believing Jewish woman but of a Greek father. (Acts of Apostles 16:1)
- Some to whom Paul spoke were not believing and spoke harshly to him and made trouble for him and other Christians.
- But when some went on hardening themselves and not believing, speaking injuriously about The Way before the multitude, he withdrew from them and separated the disciples from them, daily giving talks in the school auditorium of Tyrannus. (Acts of Apostles 19:9)
- Paul when he was known as Saul before his conversion to Christianity was one who would imprison and flog another believing in the Way.
- And I said; Lord, they themselves well know that I used to imprison and flog in one synagogue after another those believing upon you. (Acts of Apostles 22:19)
- Paul prayed for his brothers to be filled with joy and peace by your believing in Christ.
- May the God who gives hope fill you with all joy and peace by your believing, that you may abound in hope with power of Holy Spirit. (Romans 15:13)
- God saw good through what is preached to save those believing.
- For since, in the wisdom of God, the world through its wisdom did not get to know God, God saw good through the foolishness of what is preached to save those believing. (1 Corinthians 1:21)
- Yehowah lets people who love lies to go on believing them.
- So that is why God lets an operation of error go to them, that they may get to believing the lie. (2 Thessalonians 2:11)

- It is the responsibility of believing women to relieve other relations who are widows and thus not to put a burden upon the congregation as a whole if possible.
- If any believing woman has widows, let her relieve them, and let the congregation not be under the burden. Then it can relieve those who are actually widows. (1 Timothy 5:16)
- Slaves with believing owners should not look down upon their owners but serve them all the more readily.
- Moreover, let those having believing owners not look down on them, because they are brothers. On the contrary, let them the more readily be slaves, because those receiving the benefit of their good service are believers and beloved. Keep on teaching these things and giving these exhortations. (1 Timothy 6:2)
- Christian overseers should have believing children that are known as well behaved and orderly.
- If there is any man free from accusation, a husband of one wife, having believing children that were not under a charge of debauchery nor unruly. (Titus 1:6)
- To those not believing the same stone has become one of stumbling and offense.
- It is to you, therefore, that he is precious, because you are believers, but to those not believing, the identical stone that the builders rejected has become the head of the corner. (1 Peter 2:7)
- Everyone believing the Jesus Christ come from God and who loves him also loves God.
- Everyone believing that Jesus is the Christ has been born from God, and everyone who loves the one that caused to be born loves him who has been born from that one. (1 John 5:1)
