

~BELIEVED (135)

[English, supposed, thought, whispered, alleged, held, said; understood, assumed]

- The people after seeing the signs Moses performed, **believed** that Yehowah God was with them.
- At this the people **believed**. When they heard that Yehowah had turned his attention to the sons of Israel and that he had seen their affliction, then they bowed down and prostrated themselves. (**Exodus 4:31**)
- Achish **believed** that David would serve him because his own people Israel had rejected David at that time.
- Consequently Achish **believed** David, saying to himself; He has unquestionably become a stench among his people Israel, and he will have to become my servant to time indefinite. (**1 Samuel 27:12**)
- The tax collectors and harlots **believed** the message of John the Baptist, and so gained salvation ahead of the religious leaders who refused to **believe**.
- For John came to you in a way of righteousness, but you did not believe him. However, the tax collectors and the harlots **believed** him, and you, although you saw this, did not feel regret afterwards so as to believe him. (**Matthew 21:32**)
- Mary **believed** the angel's promise to her, and so gained a fine blessing from Yehowah God.
- Happy too is she that **believed**, because there will be a complete performance of those things spoken to her from Yehowah. (**Luke 1:45**)
- After Jesus was raised up from the dead, then his disciples recalled to mind, and **believed**, the scripture that foretold this happening.
- When, though, he was raised up from the dead, his disciples called to mind that he used to say this, and they **believed** the

Scripture and the saying that Jesus said. (John 2:22)

- Many of the Samaritan men of that village **believed** because of the things Jesus said in witness to them.
- Consequently many more **believed** on account of what he said; (John 4:41)
- A man **believed** Jesus word, and so his son was healed of a grievous sickness, though at a distant location.
- Jesus said to him; Go your way, your son lives. The man **believed** the word that Jesus spoke to him and went his way. (John 4:50)
- Therefore the father knew it was in the very hour that Jesus said to him; Your son lives. And he and his whole household **believed**. (John 4:53)
- Jesus showed, that if the Jews **believed** Moses, then they should also **believe** him, for Moses wrote about him.
- In fact, if you **believed** Moses you would believe me, for that one wrote about me. (John 5:46)
- Peter showed, that he and others of the apostles, **believed** that Jesus was the Messiah or Christ of Yehowah God.
- And we have **believed** and come to know that you are the Holy One of God. (John 6:69)
- Jesus showed that to remain his disciples, that Jews would have to remain in his word or teachings.
- And so Jesus went on to say to the Jews that had **believed** him; If you remain in my word, you are really my disciples. (John 8:31)
- Martha expressed her **belief** in Jesus as the son of God, the Messiah, and so was blessed.
- She said to him; Yes, Lord; I have **believed** that you are the Christ the Son of God, the One coming into the world. (John 11:27)

- Jesus showed his disciples that the father had affection for them because they **believed** that Jesus was God's son.
- For the Father himself has affection for you, because you have had affection for me and have **believed** that I came out as the Father's representative. (**John 16:27**)
- Because the sayings that you gave me I have given to them, and they have received them and have certainly come to know that I came out as your representative, and they have **believed** that you sent me forth. (**John 17:8**)
- John then entered the memorial tomb of Jesus and then **believed** the earlier word of the women, that he had been resurrected.
- At that time, therefore, the other disciple who had reached the memorial tomb first also went in, and he saw and **believed**. (**John 20:8**)
- Jesus told Thomas that persons coming later who never would see him resurrected, would experience greater happiness due to their greater faith, for they would **believe** without seeing.
- Jesus said to him; Because you have seen me have you **believed**? Happy are those who do not see and yet believe. (**John 20:29**)
- Many Jews who heard Peter speak at Pentecost **believed** and were baptized.
- However, many of those who had listened to the speech **believed**, and the number of the men became about five thousand. (**Acts of Apostles 4:4**)
- Early Christians who **believed** the message of the Good News of God pooled their belongings for the common good.
- Moreover, the multitude of those who had **believed** had one heart and soul, and not even one would say that any of the things he possessed was his own, but they had all things in common. (**Acts of Apostles 4:32**)
- Many responded by **believing** the preaching of Phillip through the Good News.

- But when they **believed** Philip, who was declaring the Good News of the kingdom of God and of the name of Jesus Christ, they proceeded to be baptized, both men and women. (**Acts of Apostles 8:12**)
- Peter and other Jews saw the Holy Spirit given to Cornelius and his household when they **believed** the Good News Peter preached.
- If, therefore, God gave the same free gift to them as he also did to us who have **believed** upon the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I should be able to hinder God? (**Acts of Apostles 11:17**)
- Some of the Pharisees **believed** that circumcision was necessary and also following all the tenets of the Law Covenant, for them to be Christians.
- Yet, some of those of the sect of the Pharisees that had **believed** rose up from their seats and said; It is necessary to circumcise them and charge them to observe the Law of Moses. (**Acts of Apostles 15:5**)
- The jailer of Paul and Barnabas took them to his house and **believed** the message of salvation they preached and was saved, along with all his household.
- And he brought them into his house and set a table before them, and he rejoiced greatly with all his household now that he had **believed** God. (**Acts of Apostles 16:34**)
- Paul greatly helped those who **believed** his message in Achaia.
- Further, because he was desiring to go across into Achaia, the brothers wrote the disciples, exhorting them to receive him kindly. So when he got there, he greatly helped those who had **believed** on account of God's undeserved kindness. (**Acts of Apostles 18:27**)
- Paul rejoiced that many were accepting the message of salvation, and becoming **believers**.
- However, whether it is I or they, so we are preaching and so you have **believed**. (**1 Corinthians 15:11**)

- The promised Holy Spirit was given to **First Century C.E. believers** after they had **believed** the message of salvation through Christ.
- But you also hoped in him after you heard the word of truth, the Good News about your salvation. By means of him also, after you **believed**, you were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit. (**Ephesians 1:13**)
- People in all the world of Paul's day became **believers** in the message of salvation through the preaching of the Good News of God.
- Indeed, the sacred secret of this godly devotion is admittedly great. He was made manifest in flesh, was declared righteous in spirit, appeared to angels, was preached about among nations, was **believed** upon in the world, was received up in glory. (**1 Timothy 3:16**)
- Paul knew the one he had **believed**, and so was not about to be shaken from his faith.
- For this very cause I am also suffering these things, but I am not ashamed. For I know the one whom I have **believed**, and I am confident he is able to guard what I have laid up in trust with him until that day. (**2 Timothy 1:12**)
- Paul encouraged **believers** to keep their minds focused upon maintaining fine works.
- Faithful is the saying; And concerning these things I desire you to make firm assertions constantly, in order, that those who have **believed** God may keep their minds on maintaining fine works. These things are fine and beneficial to men. (**Titus 3:8**)
- John showed that he and others had **believed** and come to know of the love that Yehowah God had for them through there Holy Spirit. If they remained in this love then God would remain in union with them always.
- And we ourselves have come to know and have **believed** the love that God has in our case. God is love, and he that remains in love remains in union with God and God remains in union with him. (**1 John 4:16**)
