- Job's comforters were **beneficial** only to bring adversity to him.
- They have torn down my roadways, they were **beneficial** only for adversity to me, without their having any helper. (**Job 30:13**)
- Jeremiah bemoaned that his forefathers possessed sheer falsehood and vanity and nothing **beneficial**.
- O Yehowah my strength and my stronghold, and my place for flight in the day of distress, to you the nations themselves will come from the ends of the earth, and they will say; Indeed our forefathers came to possess sheer falsehood, vanity and things in which there was nothing **beneficial**. (**Jeremiah 16:19**)
- It is more **beneficial** to lose a valued member of one's own body than to be completely destroyed because one cannot control it causing him to sin.
- If, now, that right eye of yours is making you stumble, tear it out and throw it away from you. For it is more **beneficial** to you for one of your members to be lost to you than for your whole body to be pitched into Gehenna. (**Matthew 5:29**)
- Also, if your right hand is making you stumble, cut it off and throw it away from you. For it is more **beneficial** to you for one of your members to be lost than for your whole body to land in Gehenna. (**Matthew 5:30**)
- It would be more **beneficial** to be sunk in the wide open ocean wearing a millstone than for one to stumble one of Christ's disciples.
- But whoever stumbles one of these little ones who put faith in me, it is more **beneficial** for him to have hung around his neck a millstone such as is turned by an ass and to be sunk in the wide, open sea. (**Matthew 18:6**)
- God's spirit is give to each Christian for a **beneficial** purpose.

- But the manifestation of the spirit is given to each one for a **beneficial** purpose. (1 Corinthians 12:7)
- Paul stated that his boasting was not **beneficial**, but required in self defense.
- I have to boast. It is not **beneficial**, but I shall pass on to supernatural visions and revelations of the Lord. (2 Corinthians 12:1)
- Paul showed that bodily training is **beneficial** for a little, but the godly training is **beneficial for all things**.
- For bodily training is **beneficial** for a little, but godly devotion is beneficial for all things, as it holds promise of the life now and that which is to come. (1 Timothy 4:8)
- All Scripture is **beneficial** for, teaching, reproof, setting things straight, disciplining in righteousness.
- All Scripture is inspired of God and **beneficial** for teaching, for reproving, for setting things straight, for disciplining in righteousness. (2 Timothy 3:16)
- Paul showed that maintaining fine conduct was fine and **beneficial** to all men.
- Faithful is the saying, and concerning these things I desire you to make firm assertions constantly, in order, that those who have believed God may keep their minds on maintaining fine works. These things are fine and **beneficial** to men. (Titus 3:8)
