~BEREAVED (94)

[English, lost loved one, lost something valuable]

- Rebekah told Jacob to flee to the house of her forefathers for she did not want Esau to kill him, and bereave her of both her sons in one day.
- Until the anger of your brother turns away from you and he has forgotten what you have done to him. And I shall certainly send and get you from there. Why should I be bereaved also of both of you in one day? (Genesis 27:45)
- Jacob refused to let Benjamin go down to Egypt for her was already bereaved of Joseph and Simeon.
- Then Jacob their father exclaimed to them: It is I you have bereaved! Joseph is no more and Simeon is no more, and Benjamin you are going to take! It is upon me that all these things have come! (Genesis 42:36)
- Later he due to pressure of circumstances was forced to let Benjamin go exclaiming; If I must be bereaved, I shall certainly be bereaved!
- And may God Almighty give you pity before the man, that he may certainly release to you your other brother and Benjamin. But I, in case I must be bereaved, I shall certainly be bereaved!

 (Genesis 43:14)
- Samuel repaid Agag who had bereaved many women of their children making his mother the most bereaved of children among women.
- However, Samuel said; Just as your sword has bereaved women of children, in that way your mother will be most bereaved of children among women. With that Samuel went hacking Agag to pieces before Yehowah in Gilgal. (1 Samuel 15:33)
- The congregator showed that to encounter a bear who was bereaved of its cubs was better than to encounter a stupid one in his foolishness.

- Let there be an encountering by a man of a bear bereaved of its cubs rather than anyone stupid in his foolishness. (Proverbs 17:12)
- God's woman was told prophetically by the sons of her bereaved state, make room for us. For many new sons have come forth and she was sterile and gone into exile.
- Yet in your own ears the sons of your bereaved state will say;
 The place has become too cramped for me. Do make room for me, that I may dwell. (Isaiah 49:20)
- And you will for certain say in your heart, Who has become father to these for me, since I am a woman bereaved of children and sterile, gone into exile and taken prisoner? As for these, who has brought them up? Look! I myself had been left behind alone. These, where have they been? (Isaiah 49:21)
- Jeremiah showed that when Jerusalem fell that many of its women would be bereaved of children.
- Therefore give their sons over to the famine, and deliver them over to the power of the sword, and may their wives become women bereaved of children, and widows. And may their own men become those killed with deadly plague, their young men those struck down with the sword in the battle. (Jeremiah 18:21)
- Yehowah postulated about bringing wild beasts upon the land to bereave it of its children.
- Or if I should make injurious wild beasts pass through the land and they actually bereaved it of children and it actually became a desolate waste without anybody passing through on account of the wild beasts. (Ezekiel 14:15)
- Jesus promised his disciples; I shall not leave you bereaved.
- I shall not leave you bereaved. I am coming to you. (John 14:18)
- Paul told the Thessalonians that when he was absent from them he felt as one bereaved, missing them so much.
- As for ourselves, brothers, when we were bereaved of you for but a short time, in person, not in heart, we endeavored far more

than is usual to see your faces with great desire. (1 Thessalonians 2:17)
