~BETH-ARABAH (34) (Beth-ar'a-bah) [House of the Desert Plain]

- One of the six cities within Judah's territory described as in the wilderness.
- In the wilderness **Beth-arabah**, Middin and Secacah. (**Joshua** 15:61)
- It is used in describing the mutual boundaries of the tribes of Benjamin and Judah.
- And the boundary went up to Beth-hoglah and passed over at the north of Beth-arabah, and the boundary went up to the stone of Bohan the son of Reuben. (Joshua 15:6)
- Though listed as within the tribal assignment of Judah, it is thereafter spoken of as pertaining to Benjamin, perhaps indicating the site as an enclave city of the Benjamites.
- And the cities of the tribe of the sons of Benjamin by their families proved to be Jericho and Beth-hoglah and Emek-keziz. (Joshua 18:21)

- Remaining evidence of the name may be seen in `Ain el-Gharabah, a spring on the North side of the Wadi el Qilt about 6 kilometers (3.5 miles) East-Southeast of Jericho. This location would place it in the desert region at the North end of the Dead Sea.
