- Judas betrayed Jesus by giving away his location to the chief priests so that they could silently in cover of night arrest and try him and offer him up to be impaled. This betrayal was serious sin the Bible stating that it would have been better for Judas if he had never been born.
- Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who later betrayed him. (Matthew 10:4)
- It was while they were gathered together in Galilee that Jesus said to them; The Son of man is destined to be betrayed into men's hands. (Matthew 17:22)
- True, the Son of man is going away, just as it is written concerning him, but woe to that man through whom the Son of man is betrayed! It would have been finer for him if that man had not been born. (Matthew 26:24)
- Then he came to the disciples and said to them; At such a time as this you are sleeping and taking your rest! Look! The hour has drawn near for the Son of man to be betrayed into the hands of sinners. (Matthew 26:45)
