## ~BEZEK 1 (48) (Be'zek)

- The site at which Judah and Simeon defeated 10,000 Canaanite and Perizzite troops under Adoni-bezek.
- Then Judah said to Simeon his brother; Come up with me into my lot and let us fight against the Canaanites, and I myself in turn will go with you into your lot. Accordingly Simeon went with him. (Judges 1:3)
- With that Judah went on up and Yehowah gave the Canaanites and the Perizzites into their hands, so that they defeated them in Bezek, ten thousand men. (Judges 1:4)
- When they found Adoni-bezek in Bezek, then they fought against him and defeated the Canaanites and the Perizzites. (Judges 1:5)
- When Adoni-bezek took to flight, then they went chasing after him and got hold of him and cut off the thumbs of his hands and the great toes of his feet. (Judges 1:6)
- At this Adoni-bezek said; There have been seventy kings with the thumbs of their hands and the great toes of their feet cut off picking up food under my table. Just the way I have done, so God has repaid me. After that they brought him to Jerusalem and he died there. (Judges 1:7)
- Some identify this Bezek with that of BEZEK NO. 2 below,
- Then he took the sum of them in Bezek, and the sons of Israel amounted to three hundred thousand, and the men of Judah thirty thousand. (1 Samuel 11:8)
- Which is in an extreme northern location in relation to Jerusalem and the territory occupied by Judah and Simeon. Such a view would require the assumption that Adoni-bezek came South to join other Canaanite forces but was met by Judah and Simeon, was chased North to Bezek, and was defeated there.
- The context, however, seems to indicate a place in the general area of Jerusalem. In view of these circumstances, Bezek, the city of

Adoni-bezek, is tentatively located in the Shephelah region at the site of Khirbet Bezka, about 5 kilometers (3 miles) Northeast of Gezer.
