

~BITTERNESS (102)

[English, resentment, acrimony, unpleasantness, sullenness, anger, animosity, hostility, sourness]

- Esau's Canaanite wives were a source of **bitterness** to Isaac and Rebekah.
- And they were a source of **bitterness** of spirit to Isaac and Rebekah. (**Genesis 26:35**)
- Abner called out to Joab that **bitterness** would develop if the sword kept eating endlessly.
- And Abner began to call to Joab and say; Is the sword going to eat endlessly? Do you not really know that **bitterness** is what will develop at last? How long, then, will it be before you say to the people to turn back from following their brothers? (**2 Samuel 2:26**)
- Job felt **bitterness** in his soul over his many losses.
- I, also, I shall not hold back my mouth. I will speak in the distress of my spirit. I will be concerned with the **bitterness** of my soul! (**Job 7:11**)
- My soul certainly feels a loathing toward my life. I will give vent to my concern about myself. I will speak in the **bitterness** of my soul! (**Job 10:1**)
- The heart of mankind is aware of the **bitterness** of the soul.
- The heart is aware of the **bitterness** of one's soul, and with its rejoicing no stranger will intermeddle. (**Proverbs 14:10**)
- A stupid son is **bitterness** to his mother.
- A stupid son is a vexation to his father and a **bitterness** to her that gave him birth. (**Proverbs 17:25**)
- Isaiah asked for no one to look upon him in tears of **bitterness** over the despoiling of the daughter of my people.

- That is why I have said; Turn your gaze away from me. I will show **bitterness** in weeping. Do not you people insist on comforting me over the despoiling of the daughter of my people. (**Isaiah 22:4**)
- Isaiah speaks prophetically of Yehowah's Messiah walking solemnly all my years in the **bitterness** of my soul.
- What shall I speak, and what will he actually say to me? He himself has also acted. I keep walking solemnly all my years in the **bitterness** of my soul. (**Isaiah 38:15**)
- Jeremiah counseled God's people to mourn with the wailing of **bitterness** because the despoiler would suddenly come upon them.
- O daughter of my people, gird on sackcloth and wallow in the ashes. Make your mourning that for an only son, the wailing of **bitterness**, because suddenly the despoiler will come upon us. (**Jeremiah 6:26**)
- The Son of Man is told to sigh, even with **bitterness**, over the report that he has heard of the coming destruction of his people.
- And as for you, O son of man, sigh with shaking hips. Even with **bitterness** you should sigh before their eyes. (**Ezekiel 21:6**)
- Ezekiel foretells the destruction of Tyre causing weeping of **bitterness** and **bitter** wailing.
- And they will have to make themselves bald with a baldness for you, and gird on sackcloth and weep over you in **bitterness** of soul, with bitter wailing. (**Ezekiel 27:31**)
- The He-goat Daniel saw in vision demonstrated **bitterness** toward the ram, striking it and breaking its two horns.
- And I saw it coming into close touch with the ram, and it began showing **bitterness** toward it, and it proceeded to strike down the ram and to break its two horns, and there proved to be no power in the ram to stand before it. So it threw it to the earth and trampled it down, and the ram proved to have no deliverer out of its hand. (**Daniel 8:7**)

- Ephraim, signifying Israel, caused offense to the point of **bitterness** leaving himself bloodguilty.
- Ephraim caused offense to **bitterness**, and his deeds of bloodshed he leaves upon his own self, and his reproach his grand Master will repay to him. (**Hosea 12:14**)
- Paul counseled to let all **bitterness** be taken away from Christians along with all badness.
- Let all malicious **bitterness** and anger and wrath and screaming and abusive speech be taken away from you along with all badness. (**Ephesians 4:31**)
