## ~BLACK MULBERRY TREE (21)

[Greek, sy-ka'mi-nos]

- Also called the **sycamine**, this tree is mentioned but once, in Jesus statement to the apostles relative to their faith.
- Now the apostles said to the Lord; Give us more faith. (Luke 17:5)
- Then the Lord said; If you had faith the size of a mustard grain, you would say to this black mulberry tree; Be uprooted and planted in the sea! And it would obey you. (Luke 17:6) Footnote
- The Greek word used was regularly applied to the mulberry tree, and the black mulberry, Morus nigra, is commonly cultivated in Israel. It is a sturdy tree growing to a height of about 6 meters (20 feet), with large heart-shaped leaves and dark-red or black fruit resembling the blackberry.
