

~**BOLD (69)**

[English, brave, daring, courageous, intrepid, audacious, valiant, gallant, Opposite of, **cowardly**]

- Jehoshaphat became **bold in the ways of Yehowah** and removed the high places and sacred poles.
- And his heart became **bold** in the ways of Yehowah, and he even removed the high places and the sacred poles from Judah. (**2 Chronicles 17:6**)
- The Psalmist prophesies about the Messiah and how Yehowah's answering him makes him **bold** and strong in his soul.
- On the day that I called, you also proceeded to answer me; You began to make me **bold** in my soul with strength. (**Psalms 138:3**)
- The prostitute puts on a **bold** face to attract her clients.
- And she has grabbed hold of him and given him a kiss. She has put on a **bold** face, and she begins to say to him. (**Proverbs 7:13**)
- The wicked one puts on a **bold** face.
- A wicked man has put on a **bold** face, but the upright is the one that will firmly establish his ways. (**Proverbs 21:29**)
- Jesus recommended that **bold** persistence would bring rewards.
- I tell you, Although he will not rise up and give him anything because of being his friend, certainly because of his **bold** persistence he will get up and give him what things he needs. (**Luke 11:8**)
- Isaiah prophesies about the Messiah that becoming very **bold** by stating; I was found by those not seeking me.
- But Isaiah becomes very **bold** and says; I was found by those who were not seeking me; I became manifest to those who were not asking for me. (**Romans 10:20**)

- Paul was lowly in appearance when among his brothers but he was **bold** in his writings.
- Now I myself, Paul, entreat you by the mildness and kindness of the Christ, lowly though I am in appearance among you, whereas when absent I am **bold** toward you. (2 Corinthians 10:1)
- Paul then promised to act **boldly** against those who accounted him as his physical presence indicated he was.
- Indeed I beg that, when present, I may not use **boldness** with that confidence with which I am counting on taking **bold** measures against some who appraise us as if we walked according to what we are in the flesh. (2 Corinthians 10:2)
- Paul acted **boldly** to counter those who acted **boldly** but without God's approval.
- I say this to our dishonor, as though our position had been weak. But if anyone else acts **bold** in something, I am talking unreasonably, I too am acting **bold** in it. (2 Corinthians 11:21)
