

~COMFORTED (190)

[English, soothed, consoled, reassured, calmed, relieved, eased, placated, Opposite of, **upsetted**]

- Joseph **comforted** his brother and their families that he would continue supplying them with food for the duration of the famine.
- So now do not be afraid. I myself shall keep supplying you and your little children with food. Thus he **comforted** them and spoke reassuringly to them. (**Genesis 50:21**)
- Ruth was **comforted** over the words of Boaz that he would try to repurchase her.
- To this she said; Let me find favor in your eyes, my lord, because you have **comforted** me and because you have spoken reassuringly to your maidservant, although I myself may not happen to be like one of your maidservants. (**Ruth 2:13**)
- Absalom **comforted** himself by having Amnon killed for raping his sister.
- Finally the soul of David the king longed to go out to Absalom, for he had **comforted** himself concerning Amnon, because he was dead. (**2 Samuel 13:39**)
- The Psalmist refused to be comforted unless he could find solace with his God.
- In the day of my distress I have searched for Yehowah himself. At night my very hand has been stretched out and does not grow numb, my soul has refused to be **comforted**. (**Psalms 77:2**)
- The Psalmist asked Yehowah God to work out a sign for him, for his God had helped and **comforted** him.
- Work out with me a sign meaning goodness, that those hating me may see it and be ashamed. For you yourself, O Yehowah, have helped me and **comforted** me. (**Psalms 86:17**)
- When Yehowah God brings in his kingdom upon the earth mankind will rejoice and be **comforted**.

- Give a glad cry, you heavens, and be joyful, you earth. Let the mountains become cheerful with a glad outcry. For Yehowah has **comforted** his people, and he shows pity upon his own afflicted ones. (**Isaiah 49:13**)
- Become cheerful, cry out joyfully in unison, you devastated places of Jerusalem, for Yehowah has **comforted** his people, he has repurchased Jerusalem. (**Isaiah 52:9**)
- Yehowah shows that he **comforted** Israel like a mother **comforts** her own sons.
- Like a man whom his own mother keeps comforting, so I myself shall keep comforting you people, and in the case of Jerusalem you will be **comforted**. (**Isaiah 66:13**)
- Rachel, the mother of Joseph and Benjamin, refused to be comforted over the death of her sons, who were to be killed in the Messiah's place when he came forth.
- This is what Yehowah has said; In Ramah a voice is being heard, lamentation and bitter weeping, Rachel weeping over her sons. She has refused to be **comforted** over her sons, because they are no more. (**Jeremiah 31:15**)
- Ezekiel promised that Yehowah God would provide **comfort** to the returning ones after their exile.
- But, look! There will certainly be left remaining in it an escaped company, those being brought forth. Sons and daughters, here they are! They are going forth to you people, and you will have to see their way and their dealings. And you will certainly be **comforted** over the calamity that I shall have brought upon Jerusalem, even all that I shall have brought upon her. (**Ezekiel 14:22**)
- Yehowah God would bring **comfort** to his people once they bore their humiliation for the practices that led to their exile in Babylon.
- In order, that you may bear your humiliation, and you must feel humiliated owing to all that you have done, in that you **comforted** them. (**Ezekiel 16:54**)

- When Satan the Devil falls, then all those drinking from the waters of truth will be **comforted**.
- At the sound of its downfall I shall certainly cause nations to rock when I bring it down to Sheol with those going down into the pit, and in the land down below all the trees of Eden, the choicest and the best of Lebanon, all those drinking water, will be **comforted**. (**Ezekiel 31:16**)
- When Satan the Devil falls all his crowd who followed him will be there in death, and he will be **comforted** to see them there.
- These are the ones that Pharaoh will see, and he will certainly be **comforted** over all his crowd. Pharaoh and all his military force will be people slain by the sword, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 32:31**)
- Jesus stated, that all those who mourn are going to be **comforted**
- Happy are those who mourn, since they will be **comforted**. (**Matthew 5:4**)
- The boy who fell asleep during one of Paul's discourses and died, was resurrected by Paul, and it **comforted** many.
- So they took the boy away alive and were **comforted** beyond measure. (**Acts of Apostles 20:12**)
- Yehowah God through his Holy Spirit **comforts** those who suffer tribulation for his kingdom, so that they in turn can **comfort** others.
- Who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those in any sort of tribulation through the comfort with which we ourselves are being **comforted** by God. (**2 Corinthians 1:4**)
- Paul endured tribulation so as to provide **comfort** to others, and so that they would imitate him in turn.
- Now whether we are in tribulation, it is for your comfort and salvation, or whether we are being **comforted**, it is for your comfort that operates to make you endure the same sufferings that we also suffer. (**2 Corinthians 1:6**)

- Paul describes Yehowah God as the God who **comforts** those laid low.
- Nevertheless God, who comforts those laid low, **comforted** us by the presence of Titus. (**2 Corinthians 7:6**)
- Paul was therefore **comforted** by Titus and by the **comfort** he received from true spirit anointed Christians in Corinth.
- Yet not alone by his presence, but also by the comfort with which he had been **comforted** over you, as he brought us word again of your longing, your mourning, your zeal for me, so that I rejoiced yet more. (**2 Corinthians 7:7**)
- That is why we have been **comforted**. However, in addition to our comfort we rejoiced still more abundantly due to the joy of Titus, because his spirit has been refreshed by all of you. (**2 Corinthians 7:13**)
- Paul advised spirit anointed Christians in Corinth to be comforted by the spirit Yehowah God supplies, and to lead a quiet and peaceful life as Christians.
- Finally, brothers, continue to rejoice, to be readjusted, to be **comforted**, to think in agreement, to live peaceably, and the God of love and of peace will be with you. (**2 Corinthians 13:11**)
- Paul wanted his Christian brothers hearts to be **comforted** through the Holy Spirit working within them, bringing harmony and love to them and guaranteeing their understanding of the hope ahead.
- That their hearts may be **comforted**, that they may be harmoniously joined together in love and with a view to all the riches of the full assurance of their understanding, with a view to an accurate knowledge of the sacred secret of God, namely, Christ. (**Colossians 2:2**)
- Paul was himself **comforted** by the faithfulness shown by his spiritual brothers, and this helped him to endure necessity and tribulation for them.
- That is why, brothers, we have been **comforted** over you in all our necessity and tribulation through the faithfulness you show. (**1 Thessalonians 3:7**)
