- Being slow to anger is better for an enraged man only stirs up more contentions.
- An enraged man stirs up contention, but one that is slow to anger quiets down quarreling. (Proverbs 15:18)
- A man of intrigues or lies, keeps sending forth contention and a slanderer damages relationships.
- A man of intrigues keeps sending forth contention, and a slanderer is separating those familiar with one another. (Proverbs 16:28)
- The beginning of contention is like letting out waters, there is no way to further contain them, so take your leave before it bursts forth.
- The beginning of contention is as one letting out waters, so before the quarrel has burst forth, take your leave. (Proverbs 17:14)
- Drive away the ridiculer and contention will follow him along with legal contests and dishonor.
- Drive away the ridiculer, that contention may go out and that legal contest and dishonor may cease. (Proverbs 22:10)
- Contention is like a fire without fuel when no slanderer exists.
- Where there is no wood the fire goes out, and where there is no slanderer contention grows still. (Proverbs 26:20)
- The arrogant one stirs up contention.
- He that is arrogant in soul stirs up contention, but he that is relying upon Yehowah will be made fat. (Proverbs 28:25)
- A man given to anger only stirs up contention.

- A man given to anger stirs up contention, and anyone disposed to rage has many a transgression. (Proverbs 29:22)
- Yehowah called for a contention by means of fire.
- This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah caused me to see, and, look! The Sovereign Lord Yehowah was calling for a contention by means of fire, and it went eating up the vast watery deep and ate up the tract of land. (Amos 7:4)
