~DABERATH (51) (Dab'e-rath) [Pasture]

- A city mentioned in the boundary list of Zebulun.
- Next the third lot came up for the sons of Zebulun by their families, and the boundary of their inheritance came to be as far as Sarid. (Joshua 19:10)
- And it went back from Sarid eastward toward the rising of the sun to the border of Chisloth-tabor and went out to Daberath and went up to Japhia. (Joshua 19:12)
- But regarded as belonging to the neighboring tribe of Issachar when later apportioned with its pasture ground to Levites of the family of Gershon.
- And for the sons of Gershon, of the families of the Levites, there was out of the half tribe of Manasseh the city of refuge for the manslayer, namely, Golan, in Bashan, and its pasture ground, and Beeshterah and its pasture ground, two cities. (Joshua 21:27)
- And out of the tribe of Issachar, Kishion and its pasture ground, Daberath and its pasture ground. (Joshua 21:28)
- And to the sons of Gershom they gave from the family of the half tribe of Manasseh Golan in Bashan with its pasture grounds and Ashtaroth with its pasture grounds. (1 Chronicles 6:71)
- And from the tribe of Issachar, Kedesh with its pasture grounds and Daberath with its pasture grounds. (1 Chronicles 6:72)
- Daberath is not included in the list of sites assigned to Issachar, but many geographers think it is likely represented by Rabbith at,
- And Rabbith and Kishion and Ebez. (Joshua 19:20)
- A view that finds support in the text of [Vatican Manuscript No. 1209]
