~DALETH (47) (da'leth)

- The fourth letter of the Hebrew alphabet. There is considerable similarity between the letters *da'leth* and *rehsh*, allowing for possible scribal errors in copying. This may account for various differences in spelling, such as that of the Rodanim at;
- And the sons of Javan were Elishah and Tarshish, Kittim and Rodanim. (1 Chronicles 1:7)
- And the Dodanim at;
- And the sons of Javan were Elishah and Tarshish, Kittim and Dodanim. (Genesis 10:4)
- In the Hebrew, this fourth letter is used as the initial letter in the first word of each of the eight verses of;
- My soul has been cleaving to the very dust. Preserve me alive according to your word. (Psalms 119:25)
- I have declared my own ways, that you may answer me. Teach me your regulations. (Psalms 119:26)
- Make me understand the way of your own orders, that I may concern myself with your wonderful works. (Psalms 119:27)
- My soul has been sleepless from grief. Raise me up according to your word. (Psalms 119:28)
- Remove from me even the false way, and favor me with your own law. (Psalms 119:29)
- The way of faithfulness I have chosen. Your judicial decisions I have considered appropriate. (Psalms 119:30)
- I have cleaved to your reminders. O Yehowah, do not put me to shame. (Psalms 119:31)
- I shall run the very way of your commandments, because you make my heart have the room. (Psalms 119:32)
