

**~DANGER (47)**

[English, hazard, risk, peril, threat, menace, jeopardy, chance,  
Opposite of, **safety**]

- Jesus fell asleep in a small boat when a violent storm came us and began filling history boat with water and they came to be in **danger**.
- But as they were sailing he fell asleep. Now a violent windstorm descended upon the lake, and they began to fill up with water and to be in **danger**. (Luke 8:23)
- The Silversmiths in Ephesus deemed that by means of Paul's preaching their occupation of making idols was in **danger** of coming into disrepute.
- Moreover, the **danger** exists not only that this occupation of ours will come into disrepute but also that the temple of the great goddess Artemis will be esteemed as nothing and even her magnificence which the whole district of Asia and the inhabited earth worships is about to be brought down to nothing. (Acts of Apostles 19:27)
- The city recorder said that the mob that formed against Paul's preaching efforts was in **danger** of being charged with sedition.
- For we are really in **danger** of being charged with sedition over today's affair, no single cause existing that will permit us to render a reason for this disorderly mob. (Acts of Apostles 19:40)
- Paul asked what could possibly separate him from the love of the Christ. Rhetorically he asked, could **danger**?
- Who will separate us from the love of the Christ? Will tribulation or distress or persecution or hunger or nakedness or **danger** or sword? (Romans 8:35)
- Epaphroditus exposed his own soul to **danger** so that he might assist the Apostle Paul.
- Because on account of the Lords work he came quite near to death, exposing his soul to **danger**, that he might fully make up

for your not being here to render private service to me.
