- The 5th of Jacob's 12 sons, born in Paddan-aram.
- And the sons by Bilhah, Rachel's maidservant, were Dan and Naphtali. (Genesis 35:25)
- And the sons by Zilpah, Leah's maidservant, were Gad and Asher. These are Jacob's sons who were born to him in Paddanaram. (Genesis 35:26)
- Dan was the firstborn of his mother Bilhah, the maidservant of her barren mistress Rachel, who substituted for her as a secondary wife to Jacob. It was for this reason that Rachel quickly adopted the boy and called his name Dan, saying; God has acted as my judge so that he gave me a son.
- Then Rachel said; God has acted as my judge and has also listened to my voice, so that he gave me a son. That is why she called his name Dan. (Genesis 30:6)
- The name of Dan's full brother was Naphtali. By the time Jacob moved down into Egypt, taking along the whole household, Dan himself had a son named Hushim called Shuham at;
- These were the sons of Dan by their families. Of Shuham the family of the Shuhamites. These were the families of Dan by their families. (Numbers 26:42)
- He brought his sons and his son's sons with him, his daughters and his sons daughters, even all his offspring, with him into Egypt. (Genesis 46:7)
- And the sons of **Dan** were Hushim. (**Genesis 46:23**)
- All the souls who came to Jacob into Egypt were those who issued out of his upper thigh, aside from the wives of Jacob's sons. All the souls were sixty-six. (Genesis 46:26)
- Seventeen years later, when dying Jacob called his sons to his bedside, Dan had full legal status along with the other 11 as family

heads of the 12 tribes of Israel. In blessing him, Jacob said; Dan will judge his people as one of the tribes of Israel.
