~DARE (70)

[English, challenge, defy, taunt, provoke, goad, urge, have the courage, have the guts]

- Delilah taunted Sampson; How dare you say you love me?
- She now said to him; How dare you say; I do love you, when your heart is not with me? These three times you have trifled with me and have not told me in what your great power is. (Judges 16:15)
- The Psalmist took refuge in Yehowah alone, so how dare men say he should flee.
- In Yehowah I have taken refuge. How dare you men say to my soul; Flee as a bird to your mountain! (Psalms 11:1)
- Jeremiah chastised the Moabites, how dare they say they were mighty men of war.
- How dare you people say; We are mighty men and men of vital energy for the war? (Jeremiah 48:14)
- Jesus displayed wisdom was so great that no one dared to question him.
- And nobody was able to say a word in reply to him, nor did anyone dare from that day on to question him any further. (Matthew 22:46)
- Jesus opposers dared not say that John the Baptist was from men for the people took him to be a prophet.
- But dare we say; From men? They were in fear of the crowd, for these all held that John had really been a prophet. (Mark 11:32)
- When Yehowah first spoke to Moses at the thornbush Moses dared not go any further to investigate.
- I am the God of your forefathers, the God of Abraham and of Isaac and of Jacob. Seized with trembling, Moses did not dare to investigate further. (Acts of Apostles 7:32)

- Paul asked if two men in the congregation dared to go to worldly courts, as if the holy ones could not judge them adequately.
- Does anyone of you that has a case against the other dare to go to court before unrighteous men, and not before the holy ones?
 (1 Corinthians 6:1)
- Paul did not dare to class himself with those who measured themselves by themselves
- For we do not dare to class ourselves among some or compare ourselves with some who recommend themselves. Certainly they in measuring themselves by themselves and comparing themselves with themselves have no understanding. (2 Corinthians 10:12)
- When Michael the archangel was in a dispute with Satan, he did not dare to bring a judgment against Satan in abusive terms, but deferred to Yehowah.
- But when Michael the archangel had a difference with the Devil and was disputing about Moses body, he did not dare to bring a judgment against him in abusive terms, but said; May Yehowah rebuke you. (Jude 1:9)
