~DEADLY (97)

[English, lethal, fatal, poisonous, noxious, toxic, boring, tedious, Opposite of harmless]

- Pharaoh reluctantly asked Moses to remove this deadly plague from upon him.
- Yehowah your God that he may turn away just this deadly plague from upon me. (Exodus 10:17)
- David sang to Yehowah that the good-for-nothing men were coming at his like deadly waves.
- For deadly breaking waves encircled me, there were flash floods of good-for-nothing men that kept terrifying me. (2 Samuel 22:5)
- Job showed that the cry of deadly wounded ones goes unanswered.
- From out of the city the dying keep groaning, and the soul of deadly wounded ones cries for help, and God himself considers it not as anything improper. (Job 24:12)
- Later Job argued that a man's survivors will be buried during a deadly plague and no one will weep for them.
- His own survivors will be buried during a deadly plague, and their own widows will not weep. (Job 27:15)
- When Jerusalem fell Yehowah gave the people three options, one of which was deadly plague.
- And it must occur that should they say to you; Where shall we go out to? You must also say to them; This is what Yehowah has said; Whoever is for deadly plague, to deadly plague! And whoever is for the sword, to the sword! And whoever is for the famine, to the famine! And whoever is for the captivity, to the captivity! (Jeremiah 15:2)
- Therefore give their sons over to the famine, and deliver them over to the power of the sword, and may their wives become

women bereaved of children, and widows. And may their own men become those killed with deadly plague, their young men those struck down with the sword in the battle. (Jeremiah 18:21)

- This same option was given to the survivors who rebelled against his word and went down into Egypt against his counsel through Jeremiah.
- And he must come in and strike the land of Egypt. Whoever is due for deadly plague will be for deadly plague, and whoever is due for captivity will be for captivity, and whoever is due for the sword will be for the sword. (Jeremiah 43:11)
- Zedekiah is described as a deadly wounded chieftain by Ezekiel.
- And as for you, O deadly wounded, wicked chieftain of Israel, whose day has come in the time of the error of the end. (Ezekiel 21:25)
- Yehowah promised to break the arms of Pharaoh and make him like a deadly wounded one.
- And I will strengthen the arms of the king of Babylon and give my sword into his hand, and I will break the arms of Pharaoh, and as a deadly wounded one he will certainly do a great deal of groaning before him. (Ezekiel 30:24)
- Mark showed that a sign among Christians was that if they picked up anything deadly that it would not hurt them.
- And with their hands they will pick up serpents, and if they drink anything deadly it will not hurt them at all. They will lay their hands upon sick persons, and these will become well. (Mark 16:18)
- The children of Babylon the Great Yehowah promises to kill with deadly plague.
- And her children I will kill with deadly plague, so that all the congregations will know that I am he who searches the kidneys and hearts, and I will give to you individually according to your deeds. (Revelation 2:23)
- The rider of the pale horse will kill with deadly plague,

And I saw, and, look! A pale horse, and the one seated upon it had the name Death. And Hades was closely following him. And authority was given them over the fourth part of the earth, to kill with a long sword and with food shortage and with deadly plague and by the wild beasts of the earth. (Revelation 6:8)
