

## ~DEALT (205)

[English, contracted, agreed, transacted, arranged, pact, treaty, covenant, compact]

- Abimelech made Abraham swear to, to **deal** with him as he had **dealt** with Abraham with loyal love.
- So now swear to me here by God that you will not prove false to me and to my offspring and to my posterity, that, according to the loyal love with which I have **dealt** with you, you will deal with me and with the land in which you have been residing as an alien. (**Genesis 21:23**)
- Yehowah God **dealt** well with the Israelite mid-wives for protecting the Israelite infants from the wrath of Pharaoh.
- So God **dealt** well with the midwives, and the people kept growing more numerous and becoming very mighty. (**Exodus 1:20**)
- Yehowah God **dealt** severely with Egypt for her enslavement of his people for hundreds of years.
- And in order, that you may declare in the ears of your son and your sons son how severely I have **dealt** with Egypt and my signs that I have established among them, and you will certainly know that I am Yehowah. (**Exodus 10:2**)
- Balaam felt that his ass had **dealt** ruthlessly with him, and was prepared to kill him, though the ass was actually protecting him.
- At this Balaam said to the ass; It is because you have **dealt** ruthlessly with me. If only there were a sword in my hand, for now I should have killed you! (**Numbers 22:29**)
- A kidnapper of a soul was one who **dealt** tyrannically with his brother, and was to be put to death for his badness.
- In case a man is found kidnapping a soul of his brothers of the sons of Israel, and he has **dealt** tyrannically with him and sold him, that kidnapper must also die. And you must clear away what is bad from your midst. (**Deuteronomy 24:7**)

- When Yehowah God **dealt** severely with Pharaoh of Egypt, then he sent God's people away.
- Also, why should you make your heart unresponsive just the way Egypt and Pharaoh made their heart unresponsive? Was it not as soon as He **dealt** severely with them that they proceeded to send them away, and they went their way? (**1 Samuel 6:6**)
- Saul realized that the people eating blood after a great victory was a violation of the Law Covenant, saying that they had **dealt** treacherously with Yehowah God.
- So they told Saul, saying; Look! The people are sinning against Yehowah by eating along with the blood. At this he said; You have **dealt** treacherously. First of all, roll a great stone to me. (**1 Samuel 14:33**)
- A man told Joab that no matter what he was given, it would be treacherous, if he **dealt** badly with the king's son Absalom.
- Otherwise I should have **dealt** treacherously against his soul and the whole matter itself would not be hidden from the king, and you yourself would take a position off on the side. (**2 Samuel 18:13**)
- Solomon **dealt** well with Hiram, because he himself had **dealt** well with his father David.
- Further, Solomon sent to Hiram the king of Tyre, saying; Just as you **dealt** with David my father and you kept sending him cedarwood to build himself a house in which to dwell. (**2 Chronicles 2:3**)
- Yehowah God **dealt** Jereboam a blow in the days of Abijah so that he died.
- And Jeroboam did not retain any more power in the days of Abijah, but Yehowah **dealt** him a blow, so that he died. (**2 Chronicles 13:20**)
- Job complained that his own brothers had **dealt** treacherously with him, comparing their course to that of a winter torrent that passes away under the snow cover.

- My own brothers have **dealt** treacherously, like a winter torrent, like the channel of winter torrents that keep passing away. (**Job 6:15**)
- The Psalmist sang his praise to Yehowah God for Yehowah had **dealt** rewardingly with him.
- I will sing to Yehowah, for he has **dealt** rewardingly with me. (**Psalms 13:6**)
- You have **dealt** well indeed with your servant, O Yehowah, according to your word. (**Psalms 119:65**)
- Isaiah showed that the very face of Israel testified against them, of a sin, like that of Sodom and Gomorrah. They had in turn **dealt** out to themselves a calamity.
- The very expression of their faces actually testifies against them, and of their sin like that of Sodom they do tell. They have not hidden it. Woe to their soul! For they have **dealt** out to themselves calamity. (**Isaiah 3:9**)
- Isaiah bemoaned that within Israel the treacherous dealers had **dealt** treacherously.
- From the extremity of the land there are melodies that we have heard; Decoration to the Righteous One! But I say; For me there is leanness, for me there is leanness! Woe to me! The treacherous dealers have **dealt** treacherously. Even with treachery the treacherous dealers have dealt treacherously. (**Isaiah 24:16**)
- Isaiah warned those who **dealt** treacherously with others that their treatment of others would come back speedily upon themselves.
- Woe to you who are despoiling, without you yourself being despoiled, and to you who are dealing treacherously, without others having **dealt** treacherously with you! As soon as you have finished as a despoiler, you will be despoiled. As soon as you have done with dealing treacherously, they will deal treacherously with you. (**Isaiah 33:1**)

- Yehowah God compared the treachery of Israel to that of a cheating wife seeking adultery who **dealt** treacherously with her mate.
- Truly as a wife has treacherously gone from her companion, so you, O house of Israel, have **dealt** treacherously with me, is the utterance of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 3:20**)
- For the house of Israel and the house of Judah have positively **dealt** treacherously with me, is the utterance of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 5:11**)
- Jeremiah showed that his own brothers **dealt** treacherously with him as God's prophet, when they told others to place no faith in what he said.
- For even your own brothers and the household of your own father, even they themselves have **dealt** treacherously with you. Even they themselves have called out loudly behind you. Do not put any faith in them, just because they speak to you good things. (**Jeremiah 12:6**)
- Israel's sons were not true sons of God, for they had **dealt** treacherously with their God.
- With Yehowah himself they have **dealt** treacherously, for it is to strange sons that they have become father. Now a month will devour them with their portions. (**Hosea 5:7**)
- By overstepping his covenant of peace, Israel dealt treacherously with Yehowah God.
- But they themselves, like earthling man, have overstepped the covenant. There is where they have **dealt** treacherously with me. (**Hosea 6:7**)
- Judah has **dealt** treacherously, and a detestable thing has been committed in Israel and in Jerusalem, for Judah has profaned the holiness of Yehowah, which He has loved, and he has taken possession of the daughter of a foreign god as a bride. (**Malachi 2:11**)
- Yehowah God bore witness with Israel, that they had **dealt** treacherously with the wives of their youth.

- **And you have said; On what account? On this account, that Yehowah himself has borne witness between you and the wife of your youth, with whom you yourself have **dealt** treacherously, although she is your partner and the wife of your covenant. (Malachi 2:14)**
- **Elizabeth felt that Yehowah God had **dealt** rewardingly with her by giving her a son, John the Baptist, and taking away her reproach among women.**
- **This is the way Yehowah has **dealt** with me in these days when he has given me his attention to take away my reproach among men. (Luke 1:25)**
