

### ~DECEITFUL (36)

[English, dishonest, deceiving, fraudulent, untrustworthy, cunning, lying, devious]

- The Psalmist spoke of those who loved devouring words and had a **deceitful** tongue.
- You have loved all devouring words, o you **deceitful** tongue. (**Psalms 52:4**)
- A **deceitful** witness launches forth mere lies.
- A true witness is delivering souls, but a **deceitful** one launches forth mere lies. (**Proverbs 14:25**)
- Jeremiah complained that his God had become to him like **deceitful** waters, untrustworthy.
- Why has my pain become chronic and my stroke incurable? It has refused to be healed. You positively become to me like something **deceitful**, like waters that have proved untrustworthy. (**Jeremiah 15:18**)
- Therefore you will give parting gifts to Moresheth-gath. The houses of Achzib were as something **deceitful** to the kings of Israel. (**Micah 1:14**)
- Paul called certain men in the congregations **deceitful** workers, men who tried to make themselves apostles of Christ, but were not sent forth by him.
- For such men are false apostles, **deceitful** workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Christ. (**2 Corinthians 11:13**)
