~DECEIT (74)

[English, dishonesty, deceitfulness, deception, treachery, trickery, sham, pretense, cheating]

- Jacob's sons spoke deceitfully to Shechem and Hamor, not intending to honor their words to them.
- And Jacob's sons began to answer Shechem and Hamor his father with deceit and to speak so because he had defiled Dinah their sister. (Genesis 34:13)
- Job asked will you men speak deceit before God himself.
- Will you men speak unrighteousness for God himself, and for him will you speak deceit? (Job 13:7)
- Job showed that the belly of apostates prepares deceit.
- There is a conceiving of trouble and a giving birth to what is hurtful, and their belly itself prepares deceit. (Job 15:35)
- Job himself swore that his mouth spoke no deceit.
- My lips will speak no unrighteousness and my own tongue will mutter no deceit! (Job 27:4)
- The Psalmist declares that the man who mutters no deceit will be happy before his God Yehowah.
- Happy is the man to whose account Yehowah does not put error, and in whose spirit there is no deceit. (Psalms 32:2)
- The congregator showed that a man used deceit to cover over his hatred.
- Hatred is covered over by deceit. His badness will be uncovered in the congregation. (Proverbs 26:26)
- Jesus listed deceit as among other wicked acts that issue forth from the heart.
- Adulteries, covetings, acts of wickedness, deceit, loose conduct,

an envious eye, blasphemy, haughtiness, unreasonableness. (Mark 7:22)

- Jesus examined Nathanael from afar and saw him as a man in whom there was no deceit.
- Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said about him; See, an Israelite for a certainty, in whom there is no deceit. (John 1:47)
- Paul showed that deceit was one of the works of the flesh with which wicked ones were filled.
- Filled as they were with all unrighteousness, wickedness, covetousness, badness, being full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, malicious disposition, being whisperers. (Romans 1:29)
- Paul's showed that their mouth was full of traps and they used deceit with their tongues to catch their victims.
- Their throat is an opened grave, they have used deceit with their tongues. Poison of asps is behind their lips. (Romans 3:13)
- Paul's counsel to the Thessalonians was not an expression of deceit, but was good counsel for their upbuilding.
- For the exhortation we give does not arise from error or from uncleanness or with deceit. (1 Thessalonians 2:3)
