~DECEPTIVE (96)

[English, misleading, illusory, deceiving, regarded with suspicion, not to be trusted, unreliable, unrepresentative, Opposite, honest]

- It was deceptive to find a lost object and not try to find its rightful owner, to return it.
- Or he does find something lost and is actually deceptive about it and does swear falsely over any of all the things that the man might do to sin by them. (Leviticus 6:3)
- One of Yehowah God's angels became a deceptive spirit to fool the king.
- To this he said; I shall go forth, and I shall certainly become a deceptive spirit in the mouth of all his prophets. So he said; You will fool him, and, what is more, you will come off the winner. Go out and do that way. (1 Kings 22:22)
- Yehowah God himself put a deceptive spirit into the mouths of the false prophets, whom his people chose to listen to.
- And now here Yehowah has put a deceptive spirit into the mouth of all these prophets of yours, but Yehowah himself has spoken calamity concerning you. (1 Kings 22:23)
- To this he said; I shall go forth and certainly become a deceptive spirit in the mouth of all his prophets. So he said; You will fool him, and, what is more, you will come off the winner. Go out and do that way. (2 Chronicles 18:21)
- And now here Yehowah has put a deceptive spirit in the mouth of these prophets of yours, but Yehowah himself has spoken calamity concerning you. (2 Chronicles 18:22)
- The people of Israel did not want the true prophets of Yehowah God to speak his message, but wanted it to be changed to suit them. They said to envision deceptive things.
- Who have said to the ones seeing, you must not see, and to the ones having visions, you must not envision for us any straighforward things. Speak to us smooth things, envision

deceptive things. (Isaiah 30:10)

- Can a man be morally clean when he has a cheating pair of scales?
- Can I be morally clean with wicked scales and with a bag of deceptive stone weights? (Micah 6:11)
- The deceptive power of riches chokes the study and appreciation of the word of God, making many people who claim to be religious, unfruitful.
- As for the one sown among the thorns, this is the one hearing the word, but the anxiety of this system of things and the deceptive power of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful.

 (Matthew 13:22)
- But the anxieties of this system of things and the deceptive power of riches and the desires for the rest of the things make inroads and choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful. (Mark 4:19)
- Our old personality formed before we became Christians, was being corrupted according to Satan the Devil's deceptive desires.
- That you should put away the old personality which conforms to your former course of conduct and which is being corrupted according to his deceptive desires. (Ephesians 4:22)
- Paul feared that his Christian brothers might become hardened by the deceptive power of sin.
- But keep on exhorting one another each day, as long as it may be called, Today, for fear any one of you should become hardened by the deceptive power of sin. (Hebrews 3:13)
- Men entered into the Christian congregation the Jude warned Christians about who practiced deceptive teachings.
- Wronging themselves as a reward for wrongdoing. They consider luxurious living in the daytime a pleasure. They are spots and blemishes, indulging with unrestrained delight in their deceptive teachings while feasting together with you. (2 Peter 2:13)
