[English, brought, transported, carried, distributed, sent, conveyed, Opposite of took away]

- Melchizedek blessed Yehowah God who had delivered Abraham's oppressors into his hand.
- And blessed be the Most High God, who has delivered your oppressors into your hand! At that Abram gave him a tenth of everything. (Genesis 14:20)
- Jacob called the place Peniel, for there he had seen God face to face, and yet he was delivered.
- Hence Jacob called the name of the place Peniel, because, to quote him, I have seen God face to face and yet my soul was delivered. (Genesis 32:30)
- The daughter of Reuel said, that Moses had delivered them from the hands of the shepherds near the well when watering their flocks.
- To this they said; A certain Egyptian delivered us out of the hand of the shepherds and, besides, he actually drew water for us that he might water the flock. (Exodus 2:19)
- Moses complained to Yehowah God that from the time he went in to speak to Pharaoh, Yehowah God had not yet delivered his people from Egypt as he had promised earlier.
- For from the time that I went in before Pharaoh to speak in your name, he has done evil to this people, and you have by no means delivered your people. (Exodus 5:23)
- The Israelites were told to tell their offspring about the Passover, when Yehowah God delivered his people from Egyptian bondage.
- Then you must say; It is the sacrifice of the Passover to Yehowah, who passed over the houses of the sons of Israel in Egypt when he plagued the Egyptians, but he delivered our houses. Then the people bowed low and prostrated themselves. (Exodus 12:27)

- Moses second son was named Eliezer because Yehowah God delivered Moses from the hand of Pharaoh's sword.
- And the name of the other was Eliezer, because, to quote him, the God of my father is my helper in that he delivered me from Pharaoh's sword. (Exodus 18:4)
- Moses' father-in-law felt good at hearing the report of how Yehowah God delivered Israel from the hand of Pharaoh of Egypt, and so he blessed Israel.
- Then Jethro felt glad over all the good that Yehowah had done for Israel in that he had delivered them from the hand of Egypt. (Exodus 18:9)
- Consequently Jethro said; Blessed be Yehowah, who has delivered you from the hand of Egypt and from the hand of Pharaoh, and who has delivered the people from under the hand of Egypt. (Exodus 18:10)
- Yehowah God did not want to listen to the curses of Balaam against his people, so he delivered them out of his hand.
- And I did not want to listen to Balaam. Consequently he blessed you repeatedly. Thus I delivered you out of his hand. (Joshua 24:10)
- Yehowah reminded his people that he had delivered his people out of Egyptian bondage.
- So I delivered you out of the hand of Egypt and out of the hand of all your oppressors and drove them out from before you and gave you their land. (Judges 6:9)
- Later the sons of Israel forgot that Yehowah God had delivered them from the hands of their enemies.
- And the sons of Israel did not remember Yehowah their God, who had delivered them out of the hand of all their enemies round about. (Judges 8:34)
- Israel delivered cities that the Philistines had captured.
- And the cities that the Philistines had taken from Israel kept

coming back to Israel from Ekron to Gath, and the territory of them Israel delivered from the hand of the Philistines. And there came to be peace between Israel and the Amorites. (1 Samuel 7:14)

- David felt confidence to face Goliath, because Yehowah had earlier delivered him from the paw of a lion and of a bear.
- Then David added; Yehowah, who delivered me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear, he it is who will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine. At this Saul said to David; Go, and may Yehowah himself prove to be with you. (1 Samuel 17:37)
- David delivered all that the Amalekites had captured, including his two wives.
- And David got to deliver all that the Amalekites had taken, and his two wives David delivered. (1 Samuel 30:18)
- David's men refused to share the spoil of war with those who refused to go up to the fight with them.
- However, every bad and good-for-nothing man out of the men that had gone with David answered and kept saying; For the reason that they did not go with us, we will give them none of the spoil that we delivered, except to each one his wife and his sons, and let them lead them and go. (1 Samuel 30:22)
- Yehowah God humbled David for his sin against him concerning Uriah, saying to David, that Yehowah God had delivered him from his enemies, and this was how he himself had behaved.
- Then Nathan said to David; You yourself are the man! This is what Yehowah the God of Israel has said; I myself anointed you as king over Israel, and I myself delivered you out of the hand of Saul. (2 Samuel 12:7)
- The people of Israel showed, that it was David who delivered them from their enemy nations, and now David was in hiding from his own son Absalom.
- And all the people came to be involved in dispute in all the tribes of Israel, saying; It was the king that delivered us out of the

palm of our enemies, and he it was that provided escape for us out of the palm of the Philistines, and now he has run away out of the land from Absalom. (2 Samuel 19:9)

- David made up a song of thankfulness in the day that Yehowah God delivered him from Saul, his enemy.
- And David proceeded to speak to Yehowah the words of this song in the day that Yehowah had delivered him out of the palm of all his enemies and out of Saul's palm. (2 Samuel 22:1)
- Shamah took a stand and delivered Israel from the hand of the Philistines.
- But he took his stand in the middle of the tract and delivered it and kept striking down the Philistines, so that Yehowah performed a great salvation. (2 Samuel 23:12)
- The Rabshekeh asked tauntingly; Have the gods of the nations delivered each one his own land from the hand of the Assyrians?
- Have the gods of the nations at all delivered each one his own land out of the hand of the king of Assyria? (2 Kings 18:33)
- Where are the gods of Hamath and Arpad? Where are the gods of Sepharvaim, Hena and Ivvah? Have they delivered Samaria out of my hand? (2 Kings 18:34)
- Who are there among all the gods of the lands that have delivered their land out of my hand, so that Yehowah should deliver Jerusalem out of my hand? (2 Kings 18:35)
- Look! You yourself have heard what the kings of Assyria did to all the lands by devoting them to destruction, and will you yourself be delivered? (2 Kings 19:11)
- Have the gods of the nations that my forefathers brought to ruin delivered them, even Gozan and Haran and Rezeph and the sons of Eden that were in Tel-assar? (2 Kings 19:12)
- Eleazar took a stand and delivered Israel from the hand of the Philistines.
- But he took his stand in the middle of the tract and delivered it,

and kept striking down the Philistines, so that Yehowah saved with a great salvation. (1 Chronicles 11:14)

- Ezra showed that on their return journey to Jerusalem, Yehowah God delivered his people from an ambush.
- Finally we pulled away from the river Ahava on the twelfth day of the first month to go to Jerusalem, and the very hand of our God proved to be over us, so that he delivered us out of the palm of the enemy and the ambush by the way. (Ezra 8:31)
- A king is not delivered by the abundance of military forces, nor a mighty man by the abundance of power.
- There is no king saved by the abundance of military forces, a mighty man himself is not delivered by the abundance of power. (Psalms 33:16)
- The Psalmist showed, that he prayed to Yehowah God, and he delivered him out of all things frightening to him.
- I inquired of Yehowah, and he answered me, and out of all my frights he delivered me. (Psalms 34:4)
- They cried out, and Yehowah himself heard, and out of all their distresses he delivered them. (Psalms 34:17)
- For out of every distress he delivered me, and upon my enemies my eye has looked. (Psalms 54:7)
- For you have delivered my soul from death. Have you not delivered my feet from stumbling? That I may walk about before God in the light of those alive. (Psalms 56:13)
- They will be delivered over to the power of the sword, they will become a mere portion for foxes. (Psalms 63:10)
- Deliver me from the mire, that I may not sink down. O may I be delivered from those hating me and from the deep waters. (Psalms 69:14)
- For your loving-kindness is great toward me, and you have delivered my soul out of Sheol, its lowest place. (Psalms 86:13)

- Isaiah showed, that Israel would be ashamed of their looked for hope, Egypt and Ethiopia, for they would not be delivered from the king of Assyria by them.
- And the inhabitant of this coastland will be certain to say in that day, There is how our looked-for hope is, to which we fled for assistance, in order to be delivered because of the king of Assyria! And how shall we ourselves escape? (Isaiah 20:6)
- Hezekiah was taunted that he could not deliver Israel from the Assyrian's hand.
- In order, that Hezekiah may not allure you, saying; Yehowah himself will deliver us. Have the gods of the nations delivered each one his own land out of the hand of the king of Assyria? (Isaiah 36:18)
- Where are the gods of Hamath and Arpad? Where are the gods of Sepharvaim? And have they delivered Samaria out of my hand? (Isaiah 36:19)
- Who are there among all the gods of these lands that have delivered their land out of my hand so that Yehowah should deliver Jerusalem out of my hand? (Isaiah 36:20)
- Look! You yourself have heard what the kings of Assyria did to all the lands by devoting them to destruction, and will you yourself be delivered? (Isaiah 37:11)
- Have the gods of the nations that my forefathers brought to ruin delivered them, even Gozan and Haran and Rezeph and the sons of Eden that were in Tel-assar? (Isaiah 37:12)
- Jeremiah calls for Israel to sing to Yehowah, for he had delivered the soul of the poor one from the hand of evildoers.
- Sing to Yehowah, you people! Praise Yehowah! For he has delivered the soul of the poor one out of the hand of evildoers. (Jeremiah 20:13)
- The one bringing a warning to the wicked one will have delivered his own soul, regardless of whether the wicked one listens to his counsel or not.

- But as for you, in case you have warned someone wicked and he does not actually turn back from his wickedness and from his wicked way, he himself for his error will die, but as for you, you will have delivered your own soul. (Ezekiel 3:19)
- And as for you, in case you have warned someone righteous that the righteous one should not sin, and he himself does not actually sin, he will without fail keep on living because he had been warned, and you yourself will have delivered your own soul. (Ezekiel 3:21)
- Noah and Job and Daniel could only have delivered themselves alone from the devastation that was to come upon Jerusalem, if they had been there.
- Were these three men in the midst of it, as I am alive, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah, neither sons nor daughters would they deliver, they, only they themselves, would be delivered and the land itself would become a desolate waste. (Ezekiel 14:16)
- Even were these three men in the midst of it, as I am alive, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah, they would deliver neither sons nor daughters, but they, only they themselves, would be delivered. (Ezekiel 14:18)
- Yehowah God's people would certainly come to know he was their God, when he delivered them from the yoke bar of those oppressing them.
- And the tree of the field must give its fruitage, and the land itself will give its yield, and they will actually prove to be on their soil in security. And they will have to know that I am Yehowah when I break the bars of their yoke and I have delivered them out of the hand of those who had been using them as slaves. (Ezekiel 34:27)
- Yehowah God promised through Micah to deliver his people from the chains of Babylon, and to buy Israel back from those enslaving her.
- Be in severe pains and burst forth, O daughter of Zion, like a woman giving birth, for now you will go forth from a town, and you will have to reside in the field. And you will have to come as far as to Babylon. There you will be delivered. There Yehowah

will buy you back out of the palm of your enemies. (Micah 4:10)

- Only woe will come to the man making evil gain and trusting to be delivered through it.
- Woe to the one that is making evil gain for his house, in order to set his nest on the height, so as to be delivered from the grasp of what is calamitous! (Habakkuk 2:9)
- Jesus showed, that all things had been delivered to him by his father, they had no secrets, and he possessed full authority to act in his name.
- All things have been delivered to me by my Father, and no one fully knows the Son but the Father, neither does anyone fully know the Father but the Son and anyone to whom the Son is willing to reveal him. (Matthew 11:27)
- In Jesus' parable, the master provoked to wrath by the lack of compassion seen within his slave, delivered him to the jailers to pay off his debt.
- With that his master, provoked to wrath, delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay back all that was owing. (Matthew 18:34)
- Jesus warned his disciples before going to Jerusalem, that there he would be delivered up to the Jewish religious leaders and men of nations, to die.
- Look! We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of man will be delivered up to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death. (Matthew 20:18)
- You know that two days from now the Passover occurs, and the Son of man is to be delivered up to be impaled. (Matthew 26:2)
- For he was teaching his disciples and telling them; The Son of man is to be delivered into men's hands, and they will kill him, but, despite being killed, he will rise three days later. (Mark 9:31)
- Here we are, advancing up to Jerusalem, and the Son of man will be delivered to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death and will deliver him to men of the nations.

(Mark 10:33)

- Give lodgment to these words in your ears, for the Son of man is destined to be delivered into the hands of men. (Luke 9:44)
- For instance, he will be delivered up to men of the nations and will be made fun of and be treated insolently and spit upon. (Luke 18:32)
- Saying that the Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be impaled and yet on the third day rise. (Luke 24:7)
- Luke showed that he obtained his accounts from eyewitnesses who had actually seen and witnessed these events.
- Just as those who from the beginning became eyewitnesses and attendants of the message delivered these to us. (Luke 1:2)
- Satan the Devil promised to give Jesus authority over all the worldly nations of the earth, for it had been delivered to him, in return for one act of worship.
- And the Devil said to him; I will give you all this authority and the glory of them, because it has been delivered to me, and to whomever I wish I give it. (Luke 4:6)
- Jesus rebuked a demon, and then delivered the boy who had been possessed by the demon, over to his father, the boy now completely healed.
- But even as he was approaching, the demon dashed him to the ground and violently convulsed him. However, Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit and healed the boy and delivered him to his father. (Luke 9:42)
- Jesus showed, that he had been delivered full authority from his heavenly father, and no one on earth knew the father like he did.
- All things have been delivered to me by my Father, and who the Son is no one knows but the Father, and who the Father is, no one knows but the Son, and he to whom the Son is willing to reveal him. (Luke 10:22)

- Jesus showed that during the Last Days his disciples would be delivered to enemies, even close relatives would deliver them up, because of their Christian faith.
- Moreover, you will be delivered up even by parents and brothers and relatives and friends, and they will put some of you to death. (Luke 21:16)
- The Jews said that if Jesus was not a wrongdoer that they would not have delivered Jesus over to Pilate. This was nothing more than a lie.
- In answer they said to him; If this man were not a wrongdoer, we would not have delivered him up to you. (John 18:30)
- Pilate answered; I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests delivered you up to me. What did you do? (John 18:35)
- Jesus showed, that his kingdom was no part of this world, for if it was, then his attendants would have fought to keep him from being delivered up to the Jews.
- Jesus answered; My kingdom is no part of this world. If my kingdom were part of this world, my attendants would have fought that I should not be delivered up to the Jews. But, as it is, my kingdom is not from this source. (John 18:36)
- After taking a sip of wine, Jesus delivered up his soul in death.
- When, now, he had received the sour wine, Jesus said; It has been accomplished! And, bowing his head, he delivered up his spirit. (John 19:30)
- Peter showed, that Jesus was one delivered up to the will of the Jews, through the determined counsel and foreknowledge of Yehowah God.
- This man, as one delivered up by the determined counsel and foreknowledge of God, you fastened to a stake by the hand of lawless men and did away with. (Acts of Apostles 2:23)
- Peter accused the Jews of delivering Jesus up to death, and disowning him before Pilate.

- The God of Abraham and of Isaac and of Jacob, the God of our forefathers, has glorified his Servant, Jesus, whom you, for your part, delivered up and disowned before Pilates face, when he had decided to release him. (Acts of Apostles 3:13)
- Yehowah God delivered Joseph out of all his tribulations, and gave him favor in the sight of Pharaoh.
- And he delivered him out of all his tribulations and gave him graciousness and wisdom in the sight of Pharaoh king of Egypt. And he appointed him to govern Egypt and his whole house. (Acts of Apostles 7:10)
- After being led out of prison by an angel, Peter knew he had been delivered from Herod's hand, and from what the people of Israel were wanting to do to him, over his bold preaching work among them.
- And Peter, coming to himself, said; Now I actually know that Yehowah sent his angel forth and delivered me out of Herod's hand and from all that the people of the Jews were expecting. (Acts of Apostles 12:11)
- The apostles showed, that men like Paul and Barnabas were ones who had delivered up their souls for the sake of the Good News of God.
- Men that have delivered up their souls for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Acts of Apostles 15:26)
- When Paul was brought to Caesarea by military escort, the men there delivered a letter from the military commander in Jerusalem to the governor, to explain the situation concerning Paul.
- The horsemen entered into Caesarea and delivered the letter to the governor and also presented Paul to him. (Acts of Apostles 23:33)
- Paul in his own defense, showed, that although he had done nothing wrong, he was delivered up as a prisoner into the hands of the Romans.
- However, three days later he called together those who were the principal men of the Jews. When they had assembled, he proceeded to say to them; Men, brothers, although I had done

nothing contrary to the people or the customs of our forefathers, I was delivered over as a prisoner from Jerusalem into the hands of the Romans. (Acts of Apostles 28:17)

- Paul later wrote that Christ was delivered up for the sake of Christians' trespasses, so that they could be declared righteous before Yehowah God.
- He was delivered up for the sake of our trespasses and was raised up for the sake of declaring us righteous. (Romans 4:25)
- Yehowah God in his great love for mankind did not even spare his favorite son in heaven from suffering, but delivered him up for us all. What confidence this imbues in all those undergoing discipline at Yehowah God's mighty hands, to endure faithfully.
- He who did not even spare his own Son but delivered him up for us all, why will he not also with him kindly give us all other things? (Romans 8:32)
- Paul asked his God to deliver him from the unbelievers in Judea, that he might fulfill his ministry in Jerusalem.
- That I may be delivered from the unbelievers in Judea and that my ministry which is for Jerusalem may prove to be acceptable to the holy ones. (Romans 15:31)
- Paul showed, that Christians are disciplined, but not delivered over to death.
- As being unknown and yet being recognized, as dying and yet, look! We live, as disciplined and yet not delivered to death. (2 Corinthians 6:9)
- The Scripture delivered all things up to the custody of sin, so that those having faith in God might receive the promises of God through Christ.
- But the Scripture delivered up all things together to the custody of sin, that the promise resulting from faith toward Jesus Christ might be given to those exercising faith. (Galatians 3:22)

- However before the faith, the Christ arrived, Jews were being guarded under the Law Covenant, confined from sinful conduct, while looking to the faith that was destined to be revealed.
- However, before the faith arrived, we were being guarded under Law, being delivered up together into custody, looking to the faith that was destined to be revealed. (Galatians 3:23)
- Christians are told to go on walking in love, just like Christ did, for he delivered himself up as an offering to God, a sweet smelling sacrifice.
- And go on walking in love, just as the Christ also loved you and delivered himself up for you as an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling odor. (Ephesians 5:2)
- Husbands are told to love their wives, just as the Christ loves the congregation, for which he delivered himself up in death as a sacrifice.
- Husbands, continue loving your wives, just as the Christ also loved the congregation and delivered up himself for it.
 (Ephesians 5:25)
- Yehowah God delivered Christians from the authority of darkness, and transferred them into the kingdom of the son of his love.
- He delivered us from the authority of the darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of the Son of his love. (Colossians 1:13)
- Paul prayed for others and for himself to be delivered from harmful and wicked men, for faith is not a possession of all people.
- And that we may be delivered from harmful and wicked men, for faith is not a possession of all people. (2 Thessalonians 3:2)
- Paul showed Timothy that out of all things he had suffered, that Yehowah God had delivered him.
- My persecutions, my sufferings, the sort of things that happened to me in Antioch, in Iconium, in Lystra, the sort of persecutions I have borne, and yet out of them all the Lord delivered me. (2 Timothy 3:11)

- But the Lord stood near me and infused power into me, that through me the preaching might be fully accomplished and all the nations might hear it, and I was delivered from the lion's mouth. (2 Timothy 4:17)
- Paul showed the inestimable value of the purchase price with which Christians have been delivered from a fruitless form of conduct.
- For you know that it was not with corruptible things, with silver or gold, that you were delivered from your fruitless form of conduct received by tradition from your forefathers. (1 Peter 1:18)
- Yehowah God did not hold back from punishing angels that sinned, but delivered them to pits of dense spiritual darkness awaiting judgment.
- Certainly if God did not hold back from punishing the angels that sinned, but, by throwing them into Tartarus, delivered them to pits of dense darkness to be reserved for judgment. (2 Peter 2:4)
- Yehowah God delivered righteous Lot, who was distressed by the indulgences of the Law-defying people around him in Sodom and Gomorrah.
- And he delivered righteous Lot, who was greatly distressed by the indulgence of the law-defying people in loose conduct. (2 Peter 2:7)
- Peter shows, that Christians who turn away from the holy commandment, would have been better off never to have known it, than to turn away from the commandment delivered to them.
- For it would have been better for them not to have accurately known the path of righteousness than after knowing it accurately to turn away from the holy commandment delivered to them. (2 Peter 2:21)
- Jude wrote to fellow spirit anointed Christians to put up a hard fight for the faith that had once for all time been delivered to them.
- Beloved ones, though I was making every effort to write you about the salvation we hold in common, I found it necessary to write you to exhort you to put up a hard fight for the faith that

was once for all time delivered to the holy ones. (Jude 1:3)
