

~DESERVING (130)

[English, worthy, commendable, admirable, praiseworthy, justified, justifiable, Opposite of, **unworthy**]

- No ransom must be accepted for the soul of a man who is a murderer, who is thus **deserving** of death.
- And you must take no ransom for the soul of a murderer who is **deserving** to die, for without fail he should be put to death. (Numbers 35:31)
- A man **deserving** of death was to be hung upon a stake and then taken down that same day.
- And in case there comes to be in a man a sin **deserving** the sentence of death, and he has been put to death, and you have hung him upon a stake. (Deuteronomy 21:22)
- If a man rapes a woman in a secluded place where her screams would not even be heard, then the girl is not **deserving** of death, whether she screamed or not.
- And to the girl you must do nothing. The girl has no sin **deserving** of death, because just as when a man rises up against his fellowman and indeed murders him, even a soul, so it is with this case. (Deuteronomy 22:26)
- Abiathar the priest was told that they felt he was **deserving** of death for his actions, but would not be put to death, because he had carried the holy ark of the covenant.
- And to Abiathar the priest the king said; Go to Anathoth to your fields! For you are **deserving** of death, but on this day I shall not put you to death, because you carried the ark of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah before David my father, and because you suffered affliction during all the time that my father suffered affliction. (1 Kings 2:26)
- Jesus told his apostles and disciples to search out who was **deserving** in every city where they preached, and to stay in that house throughout their visit there.

- Into whatever city or village you enter, search out who in it is **deserving**, and stay there until you leave. (**Matthew 10:11**)
- And if the house is **deserving**, let the peace you wish it come upon it, but if it is not deserving, let the peace from you return upon you. (**Matthew 10:13**)
- Anyone who commits a sin unknowingly will not be as **deserving** of strokes as one who knew beforehand and still sinned.
- But the one that did not understand and so did things **deserving** of strokes will be beaten with few. Indeed, everyone to whom much was given, much will be demanded of him, and the one whom people put in charge of much, they will demand more than usual of him. (**Luke 12:48**)
- After examining Jesus, Herod and Pilate found nothing **deserving** of death within Jesus.
- In fact, neither did Herod, for he sent him back to us, and, look! Nothing **deserving** of death has been committed by him. (**Luke 23:15**)
- The third time he said to them; Why, what bad thing did this man do? I found nothing **deserving** of death in him; I will therefore chastise and release him. (**Luke 23:22**)
- Claudius Lysias told the governor through a letter, that he had made inquiry and found nothing in Paul **deserving** of death.
- I found him to be accused about questions of their Law, but not charged with a single thing **deserving** of death or bonds. (**Acts of Apostles 23:29**)
- Paul later showed that if he was guilty of anything **deserving** of death, that he would not beg off from his **deserved** punishment.
- If, on the one hand, I am really a wrongdoer and have committed anything **deserving** of death, I do not beg off from dying, if, on the other hand, none of those things exists of which these men accuse me, no man can hand me over to them as a favor. I appeal to Caesar! (**Acts of Apostles 25:11**)

- Festus told King Agrippa that he after examining Paul had found nothing **deserving** of death within him.
- But I perceived he had committed nothing **deserving** of death. So when this man himself appealed to the August One, I decided to send him. (**Acts of Apostles 25:25**)
- But as they withdrew they began talking with one another, saying; This man practices nothing **deserving** death or bonds. (**Acts of Apostles 26:31**)
- Wicked men know of the righteous decrees of Yehowah God concerning those actions that make a man **deserve** to die, but they not only continue doing them, but they also encourage others to do them.
- Although these know full well the righteous decree of God, that those practicing such things are **deserving** of death, they not only keep on doing them but also consent with those practicing them. (**Romans 1:32**)
- Paul showed that it was a faithful statement and one **deserving** of full acceptance, that Jesus Christ came into the human family to save sinners.
- Faithful and **deserving** of full acceptance is the saying that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. Of these I am foremost. (**1 Timothy 1:15**)
- Paul showed Timothy that he should fully accept the statement that physical training was good for a little, while spiritual training benefitted all things.
- Faithful and **deserving** of full acceptance is that statement. (**1 Timothy 4:9**)
