- Solomon **desired** to built many projects within Jerusalem and in Lebanon.
- And all the storage cities that became Solomon's and the chariot cities and the cities for the horsemen, and the desirable things of Solomon that he had **desired** to build in Jerusalem and in Lebanon and in all the land of his dominion. ([1 Kings 9:19](#))
- And Baalath and all the storage cities that had become Solomon's and all the chariot cities and the cities for the horsemen and every desirable thing of Solomon that he had **desired** to build in Jerusalem and in Lebanon and in all the land of his dominion. ([2 Chronicles 8:6](#))
- Jehoram reigned for eight years in Jerusalem, and when he died of a God instituted sickness, he went away in death without being **desired**.
- Thirty-two years old he happened to be when he began to reign, and for eight years he reigned in Jerusalem. Finally he went away without being **desired**. So they buried him in the City of David, but not in the burial places of the kings. ([2 Chronicles 21:20](#))
- The judicial decisions of Yehowah God are more to be **desired** than either gold or sweet honey.
- They are more to be **desired** than gold, yes, than much refined gold, and sweeter than honey and the flowing honey of the combs. ([Psalms 19:10](#))
- The Psalmist uses the symbol of mountains to show how the governments of the earth envy the kingdom of God, seeking to have that rulership of the earth that God has desired for himself, for themselves.
- Why do you, O you mountains of peaks, keep watching enviously the mountain that God has **desired** for himself to dwell in? Even Yehowah himself will reside there forever. ([Psalms 68:16](#))

- Israel went eating and satisfying themselves, and what they **desired** they brought in to themselves.
- And they went eating and satisfying themselves very much, and what they **desired** he proceeded to bring to them. (**Psalms 78:29**)
- The wicked one has **desired** the netted prey of bad men.
- The wicked one has **desired** the netted prey of bad men, but as for the root of the righteous ones, it yields. (**Proverbs 12:12**)
- The thing **desired** or hope, is a tree of life when it comes in or is fulfilled.
- Expectation postponed is making the heart sick, but the thing **desired** is a tree of life when it does come. (**Proverbs 13:12**)
- The shepherd girl saw her loved one, as a fruit bearing apple tree among the trees of the forest, whose shade she passionately **desired**.
- Like an apple tree among the trees of the forest, so is my dear one among the sons. His shade I have passionately **desired**, and there I have sat down, and his fruit has been sweet to my palate. (**Song of Solomon 2:3**)
- Israel was to become ashamed of the mighty tree-like leaders she **desired** to lead her.
- For they will be ashamed of the mighty trees that you people **desired**, and you will be abashed because of the gardens that you have chosen. (**Isaiah 1:29**)
- Isaiah showed that he **desired** Yehowah God's Holy Spirit in the night, for his judgments led to righteousness in the earth.
- With my soul I have **desired** you in the night, yes, with my spirit within me I keep looking for you, because, when there are judgments from you for the earth, righteousness is what the inhabitants of the productive land will certainly learn. (**Isaiah 26:9**)
- Daniel **desired** to make certain the identification of the fourth beast he saw in vision.

- Then it was that I **desired** to make certain concerning the fourth beast, which proved to be different from all the others, extraordinarily fearsome, the teeth of which were of iron and the claws of which were of copper, which was devouring and crushing, and which was treading down even what was left with its feet. (**Daniel 7:19**)
- Micah showed the Israel's leaders had **desired** fields and had simply seized them, depriving men of their hereditary possessions, thus defrauding them.
- And they have **desired** fields and have seized them, also houses, and have taken them. They have defrauded an able-bodied man and his household, a man and his hereditary possession. (**Micah 2:2**)
- Jesus showed, that many righteous men desired to see the things his disciples were seeing, but did not get to see them.
- For I truly say to you, many prophets and righteous men **desired** to see the things you are beholding and did not see them, and to hear the things you are hearing and did not hear them. (**Matthew 13:17**)
- For I say to you, many prophets and kings **desired** to see the things you are beholding but did not see them, and to hear the things you are hearing but did not hear them. (**Luke 10:24**)
- Jesus greatly **desired** to eat the Memorial supper with his disciples before he died.
- And he said to them; I have greatly **desired** to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. (**Luke 22:15**)
- When Jesus **desired** to depart for Galilee, he first came to Philip asking him to be his disciple.
- The next day he **desired** to depart for Galilee. So Jesus found Philip and said to him; Be my follower. (**John 1:43**)
- The military commander **desired** to know why the crowd had tried to kill Paul, and so took him the next day before their Sanhedrin.

- So, the next day, as he **desired** to know for sure just why he was being accused by the Jews, he let him loose and commanded the chief priests and all the Sanhedrin to assemble. And he brought Paul down and stood him among them. (**Acts of Apostles 22:30**)
- Because Felix **desired** to gain the favor of the Jews he kept Paul bound in prison, though he had done nothing wrong.
- But, when two years had elapsed, Felix was succeeded by Porcius Festus, and because Felix **desired** to gain favor with the Jews, he left Paul bound. (**Acts of Apostles 24:27**)
- When Paul was shipwrecked and the soldiers wanted to kill all their prisoners, rather than to let them escape, yet the army officer **desired** to bring Paul safely to Rome.
- But the army officer **desired** to bring Paul safely through and restrained them from their purpose. And he commanded those able to swim to cast themselves into the sea and make it to land first. (**Acts of Apostles 27:43**)
- Babylon The Great is told that all the fine fruit her soul **desired** has departed from her, and never again will people find it within her.
- Yes, the fine fruit that your soul **desired** has departed from you, and all the dainty things and the gorgeous things have perished from you, and never again will people find them. (**Revelation 18:14**)
