- The lazy one has desires, but they remain unfilled, while the diligent ones is made fat.
- The lazy one is showing himself desirous, but his soul has nothing. However, the very soul of the diligent ones will be made fat. (Proverbs 13:4)
- Paul showed that after his first examination they were desirous of releasing him.
- And these, after making an examination, were desirous of releasing me, as there was no cause for death in me. (Acts of Apostles 28:18)
- Paul encouraged Christians to be zealously desirous the gifts of the spirit for the upbuilding of the congregations.
- So also you yourselves, since you are zealously desirous of gifts of the spirit, seek to abound in them for the upbuilding of the congregation. (1 Corinthians 14:12)
- Paul showed that any man reaching out for the office of overseer was desirous of a fine work.
- That statement is faithful. If any man is reaching out for an office of overseer, he is desirous of a fine work. (1 Timothy 3:1)
