[English, cease, stop, give up, discontinue, end, abstain from, call a halt, Opposite of, continue]

- Pharaoh of Egypt saw Moses and Aaron as ones who would make the people desist from their burden bearing.
- And Pharaoh continued; Look! The people of the land are now many, and you indeed make them desist from their bearing of burdens. (Exodus 5:5)
- Yehowah ordered his people to desist from all work on the Sabbath day so as to refresh themselves.
- Six days you are to do your work, but on the seventh day you are to desist, in order, that your bull and your ass may rest and the son of your slave girl and the alien resident may refresh themselves. (Exodus 23:12)
