~DESOLATED (283)

[English, deserted, isolated, bleak, uninhabited, wild, barren, Opposite of, populated]

- If Israel failed to keep Yehowah God's commandments then he would send wild beasts among them, and her roads would become desolated.
- And I will send the wild beasts of the field among you, and they will certainly bereave you of children and cut off your domestic animals and reduce the number of you, and your roads will actually be desolated. (Leviticus 26:22)
- If Israel failed to listen to their God then he would make their land pay off its Sabbaths, lying desolated until it had paid them off.
- At that time the land will pay off its Sabbaths all the days of its lying desolated, while you are in the land of your enemies. At that time the land will keep Sabbath, as it must repay its Sabbaths. (Leviticus 26:34)
- All the days of its lying desolated it will keep Sabbath, for the reason that it did not keep Sabbath during your Sabbaths when you were dwelling upon it. (Leviticus 26:35)
- All the while the land was left abandoned by them and was paying off its Sabbaths while it was lying desolated without them and they themselves were paying for their error, because, even because, they had rejected my judicial decisions, and their souls had abhorred my statutes. (Leviticus 26:43)
- To fulfill Yehowah's word by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had paid off its Sabbaths. All the days of lying desolated it kept Sabbath, to fulfill seventy years. (2 Chronicles 36:21)
- Ezra showed that Yehowah God had revived his people, so as to restore their desolated places, and restore them to Jerusalem and Judah.
- For we are servants, and in our servitude our God has not left us, but he extends toward us loving-kindness before the kings of Persia, to give us a reviving so as to raise up the house of our

God and to restore its desolated places and to give us a stone wall in Judah and in Jerusalem. (Ezra 9:9)

- The Psalmist bemoaned how the surrounding nations had desolated Jacob.
- For they have eaten up Jacob, and they have caused his own abiding place to be desolated. (Psalms 79:7)
- The Psalmist showed how he had become like the little owl of desolated places.
- I do resemble the pelican of the wilderness. I have become like a little owl of desolated places. (Psalms 102:6)
- Isaiah showed that Yehowah God would fulfill his word spoken previously, to raise up the desolated places of Judah.
- The One making the word of his servant come true, and the One that carries out completely the counsel of his own messengers, the One saying of Jerusalem: She will be inhabited. And of the cities of Judah: They will be rebuilt. And her desolated places I shall raise up. (Isaiah 44:26)
- Yehowah God helped his Messiah, so that he could bring about the repossessing of the desolated hereditary possessions.
- This is what Yehowah has said; In a time of goodwill I have answered you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you, and I kept safeguarding you that I might give you as a covenant for the people, to rehabilitate the land, to bring about the repossessing of the desolated hereditary possessions. (Isaiah 49:8)
- Isaiah showed prophetically, the spiritually desolated condition of Israel, and yet that there was still hope for her in the future.
- Although there are your devastated places and your desolated places and the land of your ruins, although now you are too cramped to be dwelling, and those swallowing you down have been far away. (Isaiah 49:19)
- Isaiah calls for the barren woman lacking sons to cry out joyfully, for the sons of the desolated woman, the Jews, were more numerous

than the sons of the woman with a husbandly owner, God's angelic organization.

- Cry out joyfully, you barren woman that did not give birth!
 Become cheerful with a joyful outcry and cry shrilly, you that had no childbirth pains, for the sons of the desolated one are more numerous than the sons of the woman with a husbandly owner, Yehowah has said. (Isaiah 54:1)
- Isaiah prophesied that after their exile, the sons of Israel would break forth and reinhabit the desolated cities.
- For to the right and to the left you will break forth, and your own offspring will take possession even of nations, and they will inhabit even the desolated cities. (Isaiah 54:3)
- And they must rebuild the long-standing devastated places, they will raise up even the desolated places of former times, and they will certainly make anew the devastated cities, the places desolate for generation after generation. (Isaiah 61:4)
- Jeremiah called for Yehowah God wrath against the nations that had desolated Israel.
- Pour out your rage upon the nations who have ignored you, and upon the families who have not called even upon your name. For they have eaten up Jacob. Yes, they have eaten him up, and they keep at exterminating him, and his abiding place they have desolated. (Jeremiah 10:25)
- In Yehowah God's eyes the entire land of Israel was desolated, because no man would take his fine counsel to heart, and so their end was clear, though not yet accomplished.
- One has made it a desolate waste. It has withered away. It is desolated to me. The whole land has been made desolate, because there is no man that has taken it to heart. (Jeremiah 12:11)
- Jeremiah prophesied, that in the desolated places of Judah, that they would yet teem with men and animals.
- This is what Yehowah has said; In this place that you people will be saying is waste without man and without domestic animal, in

the cities of Judah and in the streets of Jerusalem that are desolated without man and without inhabitant and without domestic animal, there will yet be heard (Jeremiah 33:10)

- On account of the little ones of his flock that the Babylonians had dragged about, Yehowah would cause the abiding places of the Babylonians to become desolated.
- Therefore hear, O men, the counsel of Yehowah that he has formulated against Babylon and his thoughts that he has thought out against the land of the Chaldeans. Surely the little ones of the flock will be dragged about. Surely on account of them he will cause their abiding place to be desolated. (Jeremiah 50:45)
- Yehowah God promised to leave all of Judah's high places desolated and devastated, so as to cause idol worship to cease out of their land.
- In all your dwelling places the very cities will become devastated and the high places themselves will become desolated, in order, that they may lie devastated and your altars may lie desolated and be actually broken and your dungy idols may be actually made to cease and your incense stands cut down and your works wiped out. (Ezekiel 6:6)
- Yehowah God promised to dry up Pharaoh's Nile canals, and to make Egypt a devastated place and a desolated waste, throughout her territory.
- Therefore here I am against you and against your Nile canals, and I will make the land of Egypt devastated places, dryness, a desolated waste, from Migdol to Syene and to the boundary of Ethiopia. (Ezekiel 29:10)
- Through Ezekiel, Yehowah God promised to make Egypt a desolate waste, in the midst of other desolated lands.
- And I will make the land of Egypt a desolate waste in the midst of desolated lands, and its own cities will become a desolate waste in the very midst of devastated cities for forty years, and I will scatter the Egyptians among the nations and disperse them among the lands. (Ezekiel 29:12)
- They must also be made desolate in the midst of desolated lands,

- and its own cities will come to be right in the midst of devastated cities. (Ezekiel 30:7)
- And I will make the Nile canals dry ground and will sell the land into the hand of bad men, and I will cause the land and its fullness to be desolated by the hand of strangers. I myself, Yehowah, have spoken. (Ezekiel 30:12)
- When I make the land of Egypt a desolate waste and the land is desolated of its fullness, when I strike down all the inhabitants in it, they will also have to know that I am Yehowah. (Ezekiel 32:15)
- Yehowah God promised his people to again make their once desolated land fruitful.
- And the desolated land itself will be cultivated, whereas it had become a desolate waste before the eyes of every passerby. (Ezekiel 36:34)
- Daniel prayed to Yehowah God in behalf of his sanctuary that lay desolate at that time.
- And now listen, O our God, to the prayer of your servant and to his entreaties, and cause your face to shine upon your sanctuary that is desolated, for the sake of Yehowah. (Daniel 9:17)
- Incline your ear, O my God, and hear. Do open your eyes and see our desolated conditions and the city that has been called by your name, for not according to our righteous acts are we letting our entreaties fall before you, but according to your many mercies. (Daniel 9:18)
- Yehowah now refers to the northerner, for the nations to the north of Israel, Assyria and Babylon were the eventual tools of his wrath against Israel and then Judah. If they would do this turning around in true repentance before him, then he would disperse these mighty forces from against them, and make them a waterless land and a desolated waste. Then their stink and their stench from their dead bodies would ascend, for Yehowah God would do a great thing among them, in turning them back from their purpose.
- And the northerner I shall put far away from upon you, and I shall actually disperse him to a waterless land and desolated

waste, with his face to the eastern sea and his rear section to the western sea. And the stink from him will certainly ascend, and the stench from him will keep ascending, for He will actually do a great thing in what He does. (Joel 2:20)

- Yehowah promised to regather his people to their homeland, where they would actually rebuild the desolated cities.
- And I will gather back the captive ones of my people Israel, and they will actually build the desolated cities and inhabit them, and plant vineyards and drink the wine of them, and make gardens and eat the fruit of them. (Amos 9:14)
- Zephaniah showed that Yehowah God had previously cut off nation and desolated their fortified walls.
- I cut off nations, their corner towers were desolated. I devastated their streets, so that there was no one passing through. Their cities were laid waste, so that there was no man, so that there was no inhabitant. (Zephaniah 3:6)
- Yehowah showed through Malachi that he came to hate Esau, a non-spiritual man, and he finally made him mountains a desolated waste.
- And Esau I have hated, and I finally made his mountains a desolated waste and his inheritance for the jackals of the wilderness. (Malachi 1:3)
