## ~DEUEL (34) (Deu'el) [God's Knowledge, God Knows]

- One whose son Eliasaph served as the chieftain of the tribe of Gad during Israel's wilderness wanderings.
- Of Gad, Eliasaph the son of Deuel. (Numbers 1:14)
- On the sixth day there was the chieftain for the sons of Gad, Eliasaph the son of Deuel. (Numbers 7:42)
- And for a communion sacrifice two cattle, five rams, five hegoats, five male lambs each a year old. This was the offering of Eliasaph the son of Deuel. (Numbers 7:47)
- And over the army of the tribe of the sons of Gad there was Eliasaph the son of Deuel. (Numbers 10:20)
- In the Masoretic text and the Syriac Peshitta, he is called Reuel at,
- And the tribe of Gad, and the chieftain for the sons of Gad is Eliasaph the son of Reuel. (Numbers 2:14)
- This may be due to a scribal error, since the Hebrew letters for D and R are very similar and the name Deuel does, in fact, appear at;
