- The Psalmist prophesies about Yehowah's Messiah who though derided to the extreme does not **deviate** from Yehowah's Law.
- The presumptuous ones themselves have derided me to the extreme. From your Law I have not **deviated**. (**Psalms 119:51**)
- My persecutors and my adversaries are many. From your reminders I have not **deviated**. (**Psalms 119:157**)
- Matthias took the place of Judas who **deviated** from his own place.
- To take the place of this ministry and apostleship, from which Judas **deviated** to go to his own place. (**Acts of Apostles 1:25**)
- Paul told Timothy that by making a show of such falsely called knowledge, some have **deviated** from the faith.
- For making a show of such knowledge some have **deviated** from the faith. May the undeserved kindness be with you people. (**1 Timothy 6:21**)
- Some also **deviated** from the truth saying that the resurrection of the dead had already occurred.
- These very men have **deviated** from the truth, saying that the resurrection has already occurred, and they are subverting the faith of some. (**2 Timothy 2:18**)
