

~DEVOURING (175)

[English, eating greedily, consuming, getting through, demolishing, disposing of, gulping down]

- To the eyes of Israel, the sight of Yehowah God's glory was like a devouring fire raging across a mountaintop.
- And to the eyes of the sons of Israel the sight of Yehowah's glory was like a **devouring** fire on the mountaintop. (**Exodus 24:17**)
- David figuratively describes the anger of his God, as a fire from his mouth that keeps **devouring**.
- Smoke went up at his nostrils, and fire itself from his mouth kept **devouring**, coals themselves blazed up from him. (**2 Samuel 22:9**)
- Smoke went up at his nostrils, and fire itself from his mouth kept **devouring**, coals themselves blazed forth from him. (**Psalms 18:8**)
- Men of deceitful tongue, love all **devouring** words.
- You have loved all **devouring** words, O you deceitful tongue. (**Psalms 52:4**)
- Yehowah God makes his angels a **devouring** fire.
- Making his angels spirits, this ministers a **devouring** fire. (**Psalms 104:4**)
- When Korah rebelled against God given authority, a fire went **devouring** among his household in the camp of Israel.
- And a fire went burning among their assembly, a flame itself went **devouring** the wicked ones. (**Psalms 106:18**)
- The sound of a nuclear explosion is deafening, making even the ground shake, a great sound, one that resounds outward for hundreds of miles in all directions. It creates a powerful wind, that knocks down strong buildings hundreds of miles away, and a firestorm, that burns down anything that remains, a **devouring** fire. With such power Yehowah God will speak against his enemies.

- From Yehowah of armies you will have attention with thunder and with quaking and with a great sound, storm wind and tempest, and the flame of a **devouring** fire. (**Isaiah 29:6**)
- Look! The name of Yehowah is coming from far away, burning with his anger and with heavy clouds. As for his lips, they have become full of denunciation, and his tongue is like a **devouring** fire. (**Isaiah 30:27**)
- And Yehowah will certainly make the dignity of his voice to be heard and will make the descending of his arm to be seen, in the raging of anger and the flame of a **devouring** fire and cloudburst and rainstorm and hailstones. (**Isaiah 30:30**)
- Apostates will shiver in fear when confronted with the anger of Yehowah God, which is like a **devouring** fire.
- In Zion the sinners have come to be in dread, shivering has grabbed hold of the apostates; Who of us can reside for any time with a **devouring** fire? Who of us can reside for any time with long-lasting conflagrations? (**Isaiah 33:14**)
- Israel was regarded at first by Yehowah God as holy and anyone trying to **devour** Israel, would make themselves guilty before Yehowah God.
- Israel was something holy to Yehowah, the first yield to Him. Any persons **devouring** him would make themselves guilty. Calamity itself would come upon them, was the utterance of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 2:3**)
- Jeremiah showed that the sword of Yehowah God was **devouring** throughout their entire land.
- On all the beaten paths through the wilderness the despoilers have come. For the sword belonging to Yehowah is **devouring** from one end of the land even to the other end of the land. There is no peace for any flesh. (**Jeremiah 12:12**)
- Yehowah God promised that all those **devouring** his people would themselves be devoured.
- Therefore all those **devouring** you will themselves be devoured,

and as for all your adversaries, into captivity they will all of them go. And those pillaging you will certainly come to be for pillaging, and all those plundering you I shall give over to plundering. (**Jeremiah 30:16**)

- Daniel saw a vision of a fourth beast that was **devouring**, and crushing and treading down.
- After this I kept on beholding in the visions of the night, and, see there! A fourth beast, fearsome and terrible and unusually strong. And it had teeth of iron, big ones. It was **devouring** and crushing, and what was left it was treading down with its feet. And it was something different from all the other beasts that were prior to it, and it had ten horns. (**Daniel 7:7**)
- Then it was that I desired to make certain concerning the fourth beast, which proved to be different from all the others, extraordinarily fearsome, the teeth of which were of iron and the claws of which were of copper, which was **devouring** and crushing, and which was treading down even what was left with its feet. (**Daniel 7:19**)
- Hosea showed the Israel kept **devouring** like food, sin, and lifted up their souls to error.
- The sin of my people is what they keep **devouring**, and to their error they keep lifting up their soul. (**Hosea 4:8**)
- The sound of the Day of Yehowah will be like the sound of a flaming fire, **devouring** stubble, and of chariots running on the tops of mountains.
- As with the sound of chariots on the tops of the mountains they keep skipping about, as with the sound of a flaming fire that is **devouring** stubble. It is like a mighty people, drawn up in battle order. (**Joel 2:5**)
- Habakkuk showed that his enemies felt high glee when **devouring** an afflicted one, in a place of concealment.
- With his own rods you pierced the head of his warriors when they moved tempestuously to scatter me. Their high glee was as of those bent on **devouring** an afflicted one in a place of concealment. (**Habakkuk 3:14**)

- Yehowah God promised to rebuke the **devouring** one, not allowing him to cause ruin to the fruitage of the ground.
- And I will rebuke for you the **devouring** one, and it will not ruin for you the fruit of the ground, nor will the vine in the field prove fruitless for you, Yehowah of armies has said. (**Malachi 3:11**)
- Jesus condemned the Pharisees for **devouring** the houses of the widows and for making long prayers.
- They are the ones **devouring** the houses of the widows and for a pretext making long prayers, these will receive a heavier judgment. (**Mark 12:40**)
- Paul warned spirit anointed Christians that if they kept **devouring** one another, that they ran the risk of being annihilated by another
- If, though, you keep on biting and **devouring** one another, look out that you do not get annihilated by one another. (**Galatians 5:15**)
