[English, complexity, complicatedness, intricacy, involvedness, obscurity, impenetrability, Opposite of **simplicity**]

- Rachel had **difficulty** in making the delivery of Benjamin for in fact she died during this process.
- But so it was that while she had **difficulty** in making the delivery the midwife said to her; Do not be afraid, for you will have this son also. (**Genesis 35:17**)
- The Egyptians drove their chariots with **difficulty** for Yehowah was taking the wheels off as they drove.
- And he kept taking wheels off their chariots so that they were driving them with **difficulty**, and the Egyptians began to say; Let us flee from any contact with Israel, because Yehowah certainly fights for them against the Egyptians. (**Exodus 14:25**)
- The Psalmist prophesies about Yehowah's Messiah that while under distress and **difficulty** he found solace in God's word of truth.
- Distress and **difficulty** themselves found me. Your commandments I was fond of. (**Psalms 119:143**)
- On Paul's trip to Rome they experienced **difficulty** navigating against the winds prevailing there.
- Then, after sailing on slowly quite a number of days and coming to Cnidus with **difficulty**, because the wind did not let us get on, we sailed under the shelter of Crete at Salmone. (**Acts of Apostles 27:7**)
- And coasting along it with **difficulty** we came to a certain place called Fair Havens, near which was the city Lasea. (**Acts of Apostles 27:8**)
- Paul asks; If the righteous man is saved with **difficulty**, where will anyone else make a showing.
- And if the righteous man is being saved with **difficulty**, where will the ungodly man and the sinner make a showing? (**1 Peter 4:18**)
