[English, unhealthy, unwell, contaminated, sickly, ailing, ill, poorly, sick, Opposite of **healthy**]

- A man thin or **diseased** in his eyes was not suitable for a priest.
- Or hunchback or thin or **diseased** in his eyes or scabby or having ringworms or having his testicles broken. (**Leviticus 21:20**)
- At the time of his growing old King Asa got **diseased** in his feet.
- As for the rest of all the affairs of Asa and all his mightiness and all that he did and the cities that he built, are they not written in the book of the affairs of the days of the kings of Judah? Only at the time of his growing old he got **diseased** in his feet. (**1 Kings 15:23**)
- Paul showed that any man who teaches different doctrine was mentally **diseased** about questionings and debates about words.
- He is puffed up with pride, not understanding anything, but being mentally **diseased** over questionings and debates about words. From these things spring envy, strife, abusive speeches, wicked suspicions. (**1 Timothy 6:4**)
