~DISHAN (31) (Di'shan) [possibly, Antelope]

- A Seirite, a sheik of the Horite in the land of Edom.
- These are the sons of Seir the Horite, the inhabitants of the land: Lotan and Shobal and Zibeon and Anah. (Genesis 36:20)
- And Dishon and Ezer and Dishan. These are the sheiks of the Horite, the sons of Seir, in the land of Edom. (Genesis 36:21)
- And the sons of Seir were Lotan and Shobal and Zibeon and Anah and Dishon and Ezer and Dishan. (1 Chronicles 1:38)
- These are the sons of Dishan, Uz and Aran. (Genesis 36:28)
- Says the sons of Dishan were Uz and Aran, while
- The sons of Ezer were Bilhan and Zaavan and Akan. The sons of Dishan were Uz and Aran. (1 Chronicles 1:42)
- In the Hebrew Masoretic text, Greek Septuagint, and Syriac Peshitta refers to Dishon as their progenitor. This difference in vocalization, apparently the result of a copyists error, is resolved in many English translations, AS, KJ, JB, Le, NW, Ro, Yg, by using the same rendering in both texts, as does the Clementine recension of the Latin Vulgate.
