~DISHONOR (209)

[English, discredit, bring shame on, disgrace, sully, debase, humiliate, Opposite of, dignify]

- Job showed that if he was in the right, he should not be treated with dishonor and glutted with affliction.
- If I am actually in the wrong, too bad for me! And if I am actually in the right, I may not raise my head, glutted with dishonor and saturated with affliction. (Job 10:15)
- The Psalmist asked for Yehowah God to fill the faces of wicked ones with dishonor, that they might turn around and search for him.
- Fill their faces with dishonor, that people may search for your name, O Yehowah. (Psalms 83:16)
- The stupid ones are exalting dishonor.
- Honor is what the wise ones will come to possess, but the stupid ones are exalting dishonor. (Proverbs 3:35)
- Anyone committing adultery with a woman, will find a plague and dishonor.
- A plague and dishonor he will find, and his reproach itself will not be wiped out. (Proverbs 6:33)
- He that tries to correct a ridiculer is taking to himself dishonor.
- He that is correcting the ridiculer is taking to himself dishonor, and he that is giving a reproof to someone wicked, a defect in him. (Proverbs 9:7)
- Dishonor follows presumptuousness, but wisdom is with the modest ones.
- Has presumptuousness come? Then dishonor will come, but wisdom is with the modest ones. (Proverbs 11:2)
- A shrewd man does not readily reveal his failings, but covers over his dishonor.

- It is a foolish person that makes known his vexation in the same day, but the shrewd one is covering over a dishonor. (Proverbs 12:16)
- One who neglects discipline will come to poverty and dishonor.
- The one neglecting discipline comes to poverty and dishonor, but the one keeping a reproof is the one that is glorified. (Proverbs 13:18)
- Along with dishonor one will also find reproach.
- When a wicked one comes in, contempt also must come in, and along with dishonor there is reproach. (Proverbs 18:3)
- Drive away a ridiculers so that the legal contest and dishonor may cease.
- Drive away the ridiculer, that contention may go out and that legal contest and dishonor may cease. (Proverbs 22:10)
- Yehowah will tightly wrap together all of the members of The Governing Body of Jehovah's Witnesses, and forcibly cast them out from his continued service. They will die out of his favor, and the mighty chariot-like organization they built up as their glory, will come to be the dishonor of the house of their master, for it refused to listen to, and accomplish God's will.
- Without fail he will wrap you up tightly, like a ball for a wide land. There you will die, and there the chariots of your glory will be the dishonor of the house of your master. (Isaiah 22:18)
- Jeremiah showed, that Yehowah God would lift up Jerusalem's skirts over her face, exposing her dishonor and fornication.
- And I myself also will lift up your skirts over your face, and your dishonor will certainly be seen. (Jeremiah 13:26)
- The nations have heard of the dishonor of Egypt, for her way is one of long ago, a way of oppression and injustice, a way of murder and violence. Her mighty men, strong nations, have tried to stand together to strengthen them, against what Yehowah is bringing against them, yet they will fall, both of them.

- The nations have heard your dishonor and your own outcry has filled the land. For they have stumbled, mighty man against mighty man. Together they have fallen down, both of them. (Jeremiah 46:12)
- Though large numbers of Israel fell to idol worship, still they sinned against Yehowah God, and his glory they exchanged for a lie to their own dishonor.
- In proportion to the multitude of them, so they have sinned against me. My own glory they have exchanged for mere dishonor. (Hosea 4:7)
- Here also Yehowah God shows what they have become like, now that they have gotten all they could spiritually out of his word the Bible, comparing it to wheat beer that they have drunk down, it making them drunk at first, but later, upon sobering up, they see that they have practiced wicked practices with harlots, they have gone astray. Her shielders, refer to her prominent ones, who should shield the people from wrong practices, but they themselves have loved dishonor.
- Their wheat beer being gone, they have positively treated woman as a harlot. Her shielders have positively loved dishonor. (Hosea 4:18)
- Yehowah foretold through Nahum, that he would lift the skirts of Nineveh, exposing her nakedness for kingdoms to see her dishonor.
- Look! I am against you, is the utterance of Yehowah of armies, and I will put the covering of your skirts over your face, and I will cause nations to see your nakedness, and kingdoms your dishonor. (Nahum 3:5)
- Yehowah God told his people that they would be satiated with dishonor rather than with glory.
- You will certainly be satiated with dishonor instead of glory.

 Drink also, you yourself, and be considered uncircumcised. The cup of the right hand of Yehowah will come around to you, and there will be disgrace upon your glory. (Habakkuk 2:16)
- Jesus rebuked those men who said he was possessed of a demon. Rather he honored his heavenly father, whose spirit was within him,

even though his opposers tried to dishonor him by stating that the spirit within him was the Devil's spirit.

- Jesus answered; I do not have a demon, but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me. (John 8:49)
- Paul asked his Jewish brothers who prided themselves in the Law Covenant of Moses, if they were not themselves dishonoring God by their own breaking of the Law Covenant.
- You, who take pride in Law, do you by your transgressing of the Law dishonor God? (Romans 2:23)
- Paul humbly accepted the dishonor among the nations of being an apostle of Christ, while others he taught wanted to be held in honor and be in good repute, they, not suffering for the torture stake of the Christ, as Paul and others did.
- We are fools because of Christ, but you are discreet in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are in good repute, but we are in dishonor. (1 Corinthians 4:10)
- Paul asks that if a man has long hair, is it not a dishonor to him.
- Does not nature itself teach you that if a man has long hair, it is a dishonor to him. (1 Corinthians 11:14)
- Paul showed that our becoming sons of God is sown in dishonor, and in weakness, but will be glorious through the power of Yehowah God.
- It is sown in dishonor, it is raised up in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised up in power. (1 Corinthians 15:43)
- Paul continued his preaching efforts through glory and through dishonor, bad report and good, liars and those speaking the truth. He let nothing interfere with his preaching of the Good News of Yehowah God.
- Through glory and dishonor, through bad report and good report, as deceivers and yet truthful. (2 Corinthians 6:8)
- Paul spoke to the Corinthians as though his position was weak and dishonorable.

I say this to our dishonor, as though our position had been weak. But if anyone else acts bold in something, I am talking unreasonably, I too am acting bold in it. (2 Corinthians 11:21)
